Request: NIPSCO is proposing revisions to its Rule 18 – Gas Quality

Standards to reflect NIPSCO's current gas standards. The revisions generally fall into three categories. The first category includes proposals that should encourage and facilitate the development of RNG by relaxing or eliminating certain standards, based on evolving science or actual operating experience. The second category consists of clarifications of certain provisions of the rule to avoid confusion concerning their interpretation and application. The final category consists of changes to the existing standards concerning siloxanes and gas temperatures. These changes are needed to prevent harm to the Company's pipeline system and the gas-burning equipment of its

customers.

Customer Impact: This revision will not affect any rates or charges for any customer

taking gas service under the Company's Rates, Rules, and

Regulations for Gas Service.
