**Request:** In this filing, Duke Energy Indiana, LLC (“DEI”) is seeking authorization to update Rate LED, an unmetered outdoor lighting program. Rate LED is aligned with DEI’s current lighting strategy and is intended to offer customers easily determinable pricing for a suite of modern, efficient LED lighting solutions. LED technology is evolving quickly and this filing would add products to the product line the Commission approved on December 27, 2019 (“50313 Filing”).

**Customer Impact:** Under Rate LED, customers will be responsible for paying a volumetric Energy charge of \$0.073298 and fixed monthly charges for the lighting Equipment (Fixtures, Brackets, and Wiring), Poles and Pole Foundations, and Maintenance. Each of DEI’s proposed rate components under Rate LED can be found below.
