Filed Pursuant To: 170 IAC 1-6-3(1) “Allowable filings – charges for new services;” as defined by 170 IAC 1-6-2(6) “New Rate” and 170 IAC 1-6-3(5)(A) “revenue neutral change in a specific rate schedule.”

Request: RP&L requests to add a new rate schedule (Rate Schedule N) for “Twin 70 Watt Sodium Vapor” street lights as well as add two new rates to Rate Schedule M to reflect “1000 Metal Halide” and “400 Watt Sodium Vapor” street lights. These types of lighting were recently purchased by RP&L and have been recently placed into service; however, RP&L does not currently have rates to reflect these types of lights.

Also, RP&L requests to modify its Residential Tariff (Rate Schedule R) to include clarifying language to determine if residential rates should apply to a property occupied by a tenant where service is being provided in the landlord’s name.

Customer Impact: Addition of Rate Schedule N to tariffs and modification to Rate Schedule M to include new type of lighting; as well as a modification of Rate Schedule R to include clarifying language.

Tariff Pages Affected: Rate Schedules M, N, & R

Staff Recommendations: RP&L provided an analysis with this filing (Exhibit 3) demonstrating the revenue neutrality of the new rates for the new lighting recently acquired by RP&L. These figures were based on their most recent cost of service study submitted in Cause No. 42713, as adjusted to reflect the settlement reached in that rate case.

The clarifying language added to Rate Schedule R stems from a complaint filed with this Commission (Case 88661). Copies of emails concerning that complaint were provided in this filing by RP&L (Exhibit 6) demonstrating the intent of RP&L concerning the applicability of residential rates for dwellings when used primarily for accommodations of roomers or boarders. Staff believes the additional clarifying language added by RP&L to Rate Schedule R provides the intended clarity.

Staff recommends approval of the additions and modifications sought in this filing.
