The FCC recently approved an increase in the federal USF Recovery Charge surcharge for Frontier of Rochester, in response to Tr. 114. The Indiana USF (IUSF) surcharge does not mirror the USF Recovery Charge; therefore, Frontier of Thorntown needs to maintain this existing exception in its intrastate access tariff. Frontier of Rochester's federal USF modifications does not result in any modifications to the IUSF surcharge, which this Commission established in Cause No. 42144.

Frontier is requesting to mirror a decrease in the End User Common Line Charge (EUCL) for non-primary Residential and BRI ISDN.

Frontier is requesting to mirror a decrease in interstate Prescribed Interexchange Carrier charge (PICC) rates for Multi-Line Business (MLB) and Centrex services.

Tr. 1245 represents NECA's annual interstate access filing with the FCC. This filing affects CCI and all Indiana companies that concur with CCI's intrastate access tariff. Tr. 1245 revises interstate access rates for End User Common Line (EUCL), Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC), and various switched and special access service rates. In addition, the filing reflects changes to the listings of companies participating in the NECA interstate tariff.

Note that CCI does not mirror the FUSC. Therefore, CCI needs to maintain an existing exception in its intrastate switched access tariff. Furthermore, NECA FUSC modifications do not result in any modifications to the Indiana Universal Service Fund (IUSF) monthly surcharge, which was established by this Commission in Cause No.

42144.
