JCPL WELCOMES EVIE PARRISH AS THE NEW LIBRARY DIRECTOR

Jasper County Public Library's new director, Evie Parrish, is well-known in the northern half of the county.

Parrish, 43, has worked at the library since 2005, first as the DeMotte Library youth assistant, then in 2007 as the youth librarian. In 2014, when long-time manager Diana Kooy retired, Parrish was selected as her replacement as the manager of the Wheatfield Library.

She said she was excited to serve the southern half of the county.

"I have a good idea of the northern part of the county. This will allow me to get a more well-rounded perspective for the southern part of the county and our community as a whole."

In addition to her work for the library, Parrish has also served on the Wheatfield Chamber of Commerce for 10 years, five as treasurer, and coordinates the vendors for the chamber's annual Sandhill Crane Festival.

She has also served on the KV School Board for the past three years and is a volunteer at Grace Church in DeMotte.

"I'm the type of person who always likes to try new things, to gain knowledge and skillsets," she said. "I like to know the whys and hows of things, and this position offered the opportunity to learn another whole side of libraries and that excites me."

Parrish lives in Wheatfield with her husband, Mike, and her

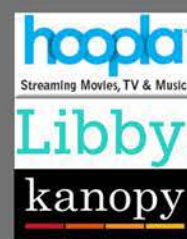

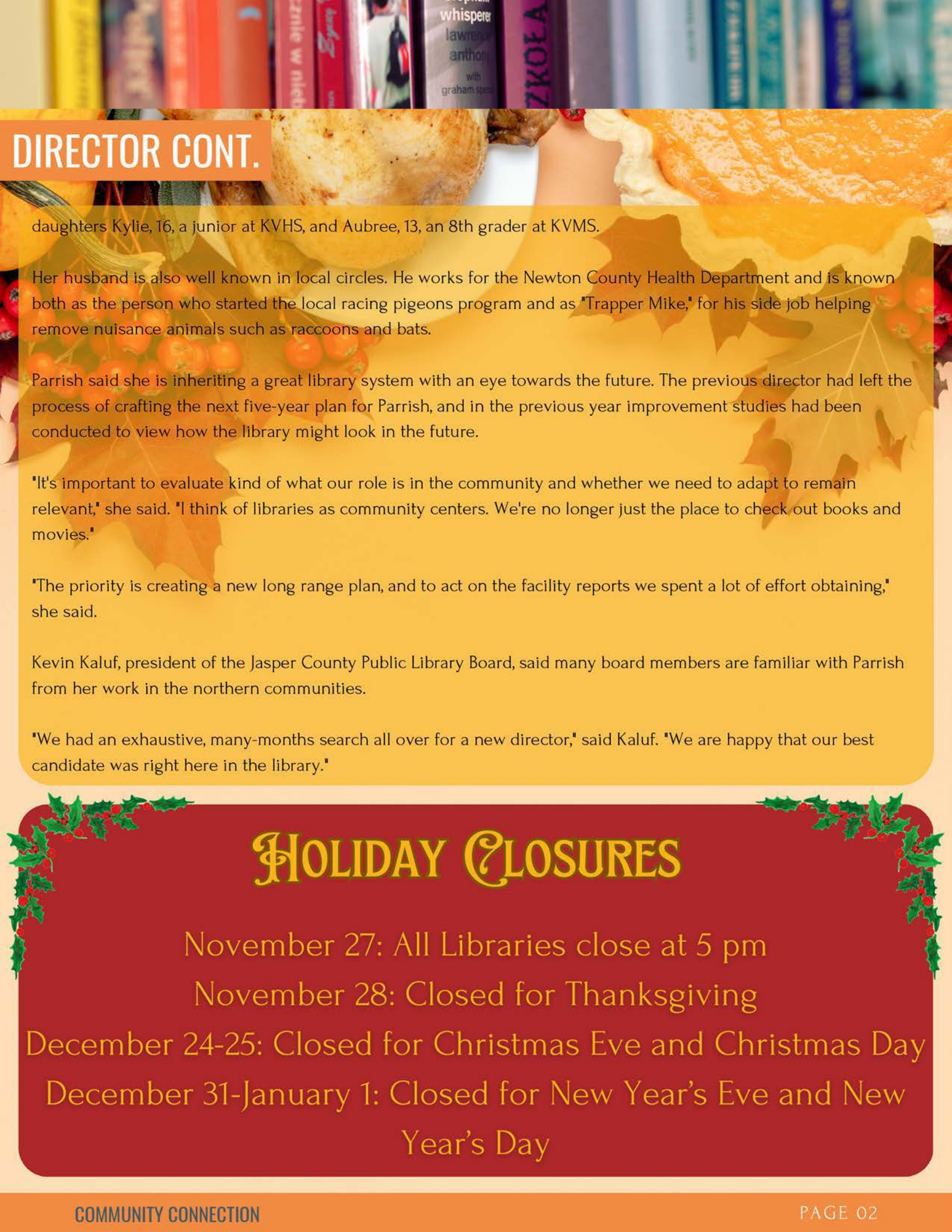

daughters Kylie, 16, a junior at KVHS, and Aubree, 13, an 8th grader at KVMS.

Her husband is also well known in local circles. He works for the Newton County Health Department and is known both as the person who started the local racing pigeons program and as "Trapper Mike," for his side job helping remove nuisance animals such as raccoons and bats.

Parrish said she is inheriting a great library system with an eye towards the future. The previous director had left the process of crafting the next five-year plan for Parrish, and in the previous year improvement studies had been conducted to view how the library might look in the future.

"It's important to evaluate kind of what our role is in the community and whether we need to adapt to remain relevant," she said. "I think of libraries as community centers. We're no longer just the place to check out books and movies."

"The priority is creating a new long range plan, and to act on the facility reports we spent a lot of effort obtaining," she said.

Kevin Kaluf, president of the Jasper County Public Library Board, said many board members are familiar with Parrish from her work in the northern communities.

"We had an exhaustive, many-months search all over for a new director," said Kaluf. "We are happy that our best candidate was right here in the library."
