January 22, 2010

The Domestic Relations Committee met at the Indiana Judicial Center on Friday, January 22, 2010 from 10:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

1. Members present. Craig J. Bobay, Frances G. Hill, Karen M. Love, Sheryl L. Lynch, Lynn Murray, Nanette K. Raduenz, Frederick A. Schurger, Debbie J. Shook, Richard R. Stalbrink, and William C. Fee, Chair, were present.
2. Staff present. Jeffrey Bercovitz provided the committee with staff assistance.
3. Guests present. Ellen Holland; Jan Raffauf, Policy Analyst; and Cynthia Longest, Deputy Director, Child Support Bureau; Karla Mantia, Indiana Prosecuting Attorneys Council; Lindsey Borschel, Web Coordinator and Daryl Stites, Web Application Developer, both from the Division of State Court Administration; and Robert Monday, PACE and Stuart Showalter, Boone County Fathers were also present.
4. Minutes approved. The minutes for the committee on October 16 and November 19, 2009 were approved by the committee.
5. Presentation by Cynthia Longest.
  - a. Cynthia Longest distributed a summary of SB 163 to committee members.
  - b. Cynthia Longest reviewed SB 163 with committee members, specifically noting the provision which would require judges in all cases to order immediate income withholding. The statute would continue to provide for an exception for good cause or an alternative arrangement. She explained the use of the exceptions under the proposed bill would require courts to indicate their use in the record.
  - c. Committee members discussed the need (1) for uniform language in child support orders to effect this proposed change in SB 163, (2) to indicate immediate income withholding should occur when the obligor is employed, if the obligor is not employed when the order is entered, and (3) to revise the Domestic Relations Benchbook in this area.
  - d. Members of the committee discussed the need for uniform procedures for use of the HIPW form, and a checklist for *pro se* litigants of items to be prepared for a dissolution case.
6. Review of Parenting Time Guidelines.
  - a. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed a copy of Indiana's Parenting Time Guidelines and discussed the use of an expert in the development of the guideline.
  - b. Members of the committee agreed to seek funding for a review of the guidelines.
  - c. Committee members agreed to a public hearing to gather ideas about amendments to the parenting time guidelines on either March 19 or May 21.
  - d. Members of the committee discussed the need (1) to explore the difference between the use of parenting time guidelines in Dissolution and Paternity case types; (2) whether the guidelines should include some kind of education provisions, e.g. use of electronic calendars for visits, use of various websites; and (3) grandparent and great-grandparent visitation provisions.
  - e. Committee members agreed to review the parenting time guidelines and prepare comments for each area for review, with a citation to that particular area in the guidelines, before the next meeting of the committee.

7. Child support calculator reviewed.

a. Lindsey Borschel and Daryl Stites reviewed comments about the use of the child support calculator received to date. Lindsey Borschel reported there were 21,000 hits on the child support calculator website since it went live on December 31, 2009. She stated the practitioners' calculator would be developed next by mid-February and would be the basis for the downloadable calculator ready a few weeks afterwards. Members of the committee thanked her and Daryl Stites for their hard work on the calculator.

b. Committee members agreed not to place the old calculator on the website.

8. Parenting Coordinator subcommittee. Mag. Bobay reported the parenting coordinator subcommittee agreed to prepare a rule in the area, which would regulate parenting coordinator conduct. They also agreed to look at other state rules and statutes in this area.

9. Future meeting dates. Members of the committee agreed to meet again on Friday, February 19, March 19, May 21, July 16 and August 20 from 10:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the Indiana Judicial Center.

March 19, 2010

The Domestic Relations Committee met at the Indiana Judicial Center on Friday, March 19, 2010 from 10:30 a.m. – 2:35 p.m.

1. Members present. Craig J. Bobay, Frances G. Hill, Karen M. Love, Lynn Murray, Nanette K. Raduenz, Frederick A. Schurger, Debbie J. Shook, Richard R. Stalbrink, Dean A. Young, and William C. Fee, Chair, were present.
2. Staff present. Jeffrey Bercovitz provided the committee with staff assistance.
3. Guests present. Jan Raffauf, Policy Analyst; and Cynthia Longest, Deputy Director, Child Support Bureau; Lindsey Borschel, Web Coordinator and Daryl Stites, Web Application Developer, both from the Division of State Court Administration; and Robert Monday, PACE; and Stuart Showalter, Indiana Custodial Rights Advocates; and Jason Cannon and Chris Ochs were also present.
4. Minutes approved. The minutes for the committee on January 22, 2010 were approved by the committee.
5. Review of Parenting Time Guidelines.
  - a. Committee members discussed how the revisions to the parenting time guidelines should (1) address issues judicial officers see in the courtroom, and (2) look at the underlying premises of the guidelines. Members of the committee agreed to reach out to fathers, mothers, attorneys, child psychologists, bar associations, and invite comments from them.
  - b. Committee members agreed to gather all comments and organize them into topic areas. Jeff Bercovitz will do the initial sort of comments into topic areas. Committee members agreed to let the Judicial Center know the area they want to work in by April 2, 2010. They agreed to review comments in the area they have selected.
  - c. Members of the committee agreed to invite comment from experts and organizations rather than relying on one expert. Committee members should let the Judicial Center know the experts and organizations which should be invited to comment on the parenting time guidelines by April 2, 2010.
  - d. Judge Hill requested changing the numbering system of the parenting time guidelines in order to get more captions and a better table of contents.
  - e. Members of the committee agreed to review a technological area of parenting time, which may include parenting plans, (e.g. Lake Co.), electronic parenting time, the “OurFamilyWizard” software, and other areas.
  - g. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed a draft copy of notice of the public hearing for Indiana’s Parenting Time Guidelines Review, which was revised. Committee members agreed to a public hearing to gather ideas about amendments to the parenting time guidelines on May 21, 2010. They discussed taking public comment once a revised draft was completed.
6. Guest comments:
  - a. Bob Monday suggested looking ahead seven to ten years during this review of the parenting time guidelines.

- b. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed materials from Stuart Showalter entitled, "Virtual Visitation."
7. Child support calculators reviewed. Lindsey Borschel and Daryl Stites, Division of State Court Administration: (1) demonstrated the practitioner's calculator to members of the committee. They noted this calculator was streamlined and will have little help with it. They also reported the child support worksheets will note, at the bottom of each page, which calculator produced it; (2) showed a preview of the downloadable calculator, which is similar to the practitioner's calculator; and (3) reported updates to the step by step calculator, including its production of a child support worksheet for amounts under the combined weekly adjusted income of \$100 per week.
8. Recent legislation.
- a. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed Senate Bill 163 to members of the committee. Cynthia Longest, Child Support Bureau, Department of Child Services agreed to work with Magistrate Bobay on language for the immediate income withholding under this new law.
- b. Senate Bill 178, concerning the paternity affidavit, was distributed to the committee.
9. Other. Judge Fee distributed AFCC materials for their conference on June 2-5, 2010 in Denver, Colorado. He also discussed formation of a working group for the AFCC conference coming in the fall of 2011 to Indiana.
10. Future meeting dates. Members of the committee agreed to meet again on Friday, May 21, July 16 and August 20, October 22 and November 19, from 10:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the Indiana Judicial Center.

Committee members discussed various areas mentioned in the public hearing including not blindly following the parenting time guidelines (PTG); whether there should be a 50/50 presumption of parenting; guidelines addressing a special needs child; adding a glossary of terms; enforcement of parenting time on behalf of the noncustodial parent if parenting time denied by the custodial parent or on behalf of the custodial parent if the child must wait for the noncustodial parent to pick up the child or sporadic parenting time with a child focus on either situation; better and more quantifiable measures to determine enforcement issues, better tools for enforcement of parenting time issues and quicker determination of parenting time issue; prevention of any changes to the use of the PTG in domestic violence situations; stepparent issues; and alienation issues.

6. Child Support Guidelines Calculator.

a. Andrew Ault, Attorney At Law, expressed concern that Social Security Disability income was not being added to Line 1 of the child support obligation worksheet and subtracted from the child support obligation on Line 8 of the worksheet. Committee members agreed the child support calculator should be changed to indicate the inclusion of this income and the credit against the child support obligation. c. Jeffrey Bercovitz agreed to continue to explore funding of overnights with the Department of Child Services.

6. Child Support Guidelines Calculator.

a. Members of the committee discussed a child support “estimator” in which a court could quickly calculate child support. The only forms they needed were the CSOW and HIPW with the estimate printed on the forms. It could even be noted on these forms “Estimate-Not Valid for Use in Court.” Lindsey Borschel agreed to return to the committee at their October meeting to discuss a child support estimator.

b. Lindsey Borschel demonstrated the downloadable calculator to the members of the committee. Jeff Bercovitz agreed to forward a link to the committee members to test out the calculator and return comments and questions to Lindsey Borschel.

c. Lindsey Borschel discussed the logic of how to get Social Security Disability income and indicate the calculation of its credit on the worksheet to address this concern. Members of the committee discussed the display of this calculation on the Child Support Obligation Worksheet.

c. Jeffrey Bercovitz reported JTAC, through Lindsey Borschel and Judge Fee would conduct a session at the September Judicial Conference showing the various features on the suite of Indiana’s child support calculators with laptops for conferees to use during the session. She agreed to discuss the differences between the three calculators and focus her remarks on the downloadable one.

5. Review of Draft Parenting Coordination Rule.
  - a. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed a draft “Indiana Rules for Parenting Coordination” dated October 22, 2010 for discussion purposes. He said it was not a public document at this time.
  - b. Magistrate Bobay thanked subcommittee members and staff in the development of this draft rule. He reported the subcommittee believed this should be a stand-alone rule, sources of various portions of the rule were noted, the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts guidelines were very helpful in development of the rule, and a table of contents may be needed.
  - c. Magistrate Bobay, Magistrate Ransberger, and Magistrate Raduenz reviewed the draft rule with the joint committee.
  - d. The members of the joint committee discussed the draft rule. They agreed the subcommittee would make revisions based on the comments, would prepare a commentary to the rule, and should bring it back to the joint committee on Friday, January 21, 2011 for consideration. The members of the joint committee discussed public input to the rule if it goes forward and consideration of a proposed rule by the Board of Directors of the Judicial Conference of Indiana.

2. Staff present. Jeffrey Bercovitz provided the committee with staff assistance.
3. Guests present. Lindsey Borschel, and Bob Rath, Division of State Court Administration; and Stuart Showalter, Indiana Custodial Rights Advocates, were also present.
4. Minutes approved. The minutes for the committee on October 22, 2010 were approved by the committee.
5. Paternity affidavit. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed materials on the paternity affidavit. Bob Rath noted the affidavit requires a social security number from each parent, which has been a statutory requirement for a few years. Jeffrey Bercovitz indicated there is a federal lawsuit pending on the lack of acceptance by the Board of Health of the paternity affidavit when there is no social security number from each parent, but the child is a citizen. Committee members indicated a father or mother could go to the Title IV-D prosecutor's office and have them prepare an agreed judgment of paternity for court approval.
6. ICLEF program. Judge Fee reported he was recently approached by ICLEF on additional training on the new Child Support Rules and Guidelines. Committee members discussed it might be more useful to conduct a conference on a draft of the parenting time guidelines. In addition, members of the committee discussed a session on medical support under the child support guidelines.
7. Distribution of comment. Jeffrey Bercovitz distributed a comment on the parenting time guidelines from Mr. Joseph George to committee members.
8. Parenting Time Guidelines revisions. Members of the committee completed review of suggested revisions from Judge Fee and Judge Love concerning scheduled parenting time to occur as planned. Committee members also discussed the effect of amendments on existing parenting time orders. Mag. Raduenz and Judge Young to discuss these areas at the next meeting: (a) Presume More Time for Noncustodial Parent, (NCP)/Protection of NCP rights /Overnights/ Overnights for Infants and (b) Equal Parenting Time
9. Child Support Calculator.
  - a. Magistrate Raduenz gave a report on her presentation at the Family Court Annual Meeting, and the comments she received about the child support calculator and the amendments suggested to the parenting time guidelines.
  - b. Lindsey Borschel reported the number of "hits" on the website of the child support calculator. She also said she will no longer have a website developer assigned to the Calculator and that JTAC would prioritize our requests with others they receive.

c. Members of the committee prioritized their requests as follows: (1) The addition of a social security disability calculation to all calculators, (2) A quick input calculator for high volume courts, and (3) The development of a separate “income calculator” for the purposes of adding together various sources of income of parents for use in the child support rules and guidelines.

10. Future meeting dates. Committee members agreed to meet again on Friday, January 21, February 18, March 18, May 20, July 15, August 19, and November 18, 2011 from 10:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the Judicial Center. They also agreed to meet in conjunction with the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts Regional Meeting in Indianapolis on Oct. 27-29, 2011 in Indianapolis.
