2011 Technology Sub-Grants

The Indiana State Library received 46 Technology applications requesting \$387,265 in LSTA funds. Due to uncertainties in federal funding, the awards were made in three rounds.

In the first round of awards announced 3/24/2011, the State Library awarded over \$106,000 to 13 libraries.
