

2019 LSTA Sub-Grants *Awards Summary*

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2019 Technology Sub-Grants

The Indiana State Library received 19 technology applications requesting \$132,235 in LSTA funds. 17 libraries and partnering organizations received full or partial funding, totaling \$115,548.

The Indiana State Library received 12 applications for digitization projects requesting \$132,328 in LSTA funds. All 12 libraries and partnering organizations received partial or complete funding, receiving \$119,453.
