- I. Call Meeting to Order
 - N. Schenkel called meeting to order at 1.01 PM
- II. Welcome New Members & Introductions
 - New members welcomed by chair, N. Schenkel, with introductions by each committee member
- III. Approval of Agenda
 - T. Rue motion; C. Mitchell, 2nd; unanimous approval.
- IV. Approval of Minutes
 - M. Shaw motion; J. Siemon, 2nd; unanimous approval.
- V. State Library Report
 - Evergreen update
 - i. Instability of Evergreen servers in Jan/Feb; resolved. Equinox Open Library Initiative is providing additional support.
 - ii. Migration of a new library of Porter County Public Library joining 22 March—130th member. Porter is the largest public library to join Evergreen to date, serving over 150,000 people.
 - iii. ISL is fielding questions regarding Indiana Digital Library Overdrive consortium. There are 200 member libraries including all Evergreen

libraries. N. Brock will add as a continuing report in future. ISL pays platform fee, and individual libraries pay for materials.

- iv. Fill percentage is not tracked; however, requests that go through should be able to be filled.
- IN-SHARE update
 - i. N. Brock has combined IN-SHARE and SRCS on chart
 - ii. Serves Indiana libraries that don't have an OCLC symbol on their own
 - iii. Want SHARE numbers to decrease, and SRCS numbers to increase
 - SRCS update
 - i. Provides unmediated interlibrary loan for participating libraries
 - ii. Alleviates pressure from SHARE
 - iii. Main SRCS challenge is that it does not function as well with academic library discovery layers and systems
 - iv. AutoGraphics is working toward integration with OCLC, especially because of PALNI libraries using WMS. AG will create a Z39.50 that will search all Z targets. Waiting on WorldShare and Tipasa, but hopefully functional by summer. Requesting will happen behind scenes with ISO. Targeting end of April to start testing. AG is also talking to other discovery vendors—in very early stages.
 - v. N. Brock says a growing percentage (perhaps mid-to-upper 80%) are being filled.
 - InfoExpress update
 - i. 2021/2022 statistics appear to indicate healthy return to statewide resource sharing.
 - ii. N. Brock has had two new library enquiries about joining InfoExpress (probably IN-SHARE libraries as well).
 - iii. Still interest in opening up discovery of “dark” collections.
 - iv. Current contract expires 30 June 2023; will be working on RFP. Agencies across state government have been asked to delay RFP's. Price increase anticipated in July 2023.
 - v. Current contract not impacted by fluctuating/rising fuel costs.

- INSPIRE update
 - i. Committee decided to focus on full-text numbers.
 - ii. January 2022 is looking a little higher than Jan 2021
 - iii. Search terms were included
 - iv. General discussion was held about the need to advocate for school librarians throughout the State of Indiana to be returned to library operations. Committee members are generally concerned about corporations where school librarians have been reassigned to classrooms rather than operating media centers and providing information literacy instruction to students.
 1. MCLS has created a Bridging Information Literacy from School to College Using INSPIRE grant opportunities.
 2. K. Cleveland mentioned INSPIRE app for mobiles, which may be attractive.
 3. J. Speer mentioned on-going marketing work for school contacts. Interested in recruiting an education person for ILHB, who may be invited to join ISL RSC meeting in the future.
 - v. Discussion about EBSCO interface changes, which are more useable and create additional white space. Test sites may already implement.

VI. Old Business

- Membership vacancies
 - i. Difficult for school librarians to get away to join meetings. Continuing work to recruit.

VII. New Business

- Discovery to Delivery 2022
 - i. Propose 7 October 2022; space free at ISL and no known conflicts for hybrid online and in-person conference.
 - ii. Back to call for proposals and partnership with ALI.
 - iii. M. Paxton suggests call for volunteers ahead of CFP. Put out a save-the-date and call for volunteers. N. Schenkel volunteers. Suggested names for subcommittee should be sent to N. Schenkel and N. Brock.
