## August 11th, 1984: The Hoosier Dome opens

In 1984, the Hoosier Dome opened its doors to the Indianapolis Colts and their fans. On August 11th, they defeated the New York Giants in their first game in the new stadium, to the great joy of their home city. Completed at a cost of nearly eighty million dollars, the stadium would host countless football games, music concerts, and other events for the next twenty three years. It was demolished in 2007, and replaced by Lucas Oil Stadium the following year.
