





Am I in a Census Bureau survey?

Have you received a form at your home from the U.S. Census Bureau or U.S. Department of Commerce, and you want to make sure it is legitimate? Has someone visited your home or apartment to ask you for information, and you want to verify who they are? To speak with someone at the Census Bureau, call the <u>Regional Office</u> for the state where you live (in Indiana, it's the <u>Chicago Region</u>) or contact the Census Bureau's general <u>Customer Service Center</u>. You can also visit this website for help verifying participation in a survey: <u>Verify a Census Bureau Survey</u>, <u>Mailing</u>, or <u>Contact</u>. If someone knocks on your door, Census Bureau Field Representatives will always have an ID badge from the Department of Commerce clearly displaying their name and photograph.
