The General Register Office is the central civil repository for records relating to Births, Stillbirths, Adoptions, Marriages, Civil Partnerships, and Deaths in Ireland. Marriage records other than Roman Catholic marriages date back to 1st April 1845. Records of Births, Deaths and Roman Catholic Marriages date back to 1st January 1864. They do not conduct Genealogical or Family History research.

#### Valuation Office

The Valuation Office has a manuscript archive containing rate-able valuation information of all property in the state from mid 1850s until the early 1990s; and commercial property only from that time. This archive shows the changes after the revision of properties and is recognized as a census substitute for the period from the 1850's to 1901 (the earliest complete census record for Ireland).
