This Week in Indiana History May 30th, 1911: Ray Harroun Wins the First Indianapolis 500

In 1911, the Indianapolis Motor Speedway decided to focus on a single major event that would attract famous drivers and large audiences. It was decided that it would be an endurance race of 500 miles in May.

Ray Harroun, an engineer and racer who came out of retirement to compete, would go on to win the race and the grand prize of \$27,500. The success of the inaugural Indianapolis 500 would cement its status as one of the most respected and popular racing events in the world.
