Salem's Library Grants Center

Anyone looking for a one-stop shop of great grant resources, including lists of available grants and grantwriting tutorials, should check out the **Salem's Library Grants Center**. This free

web tool is designed to help librarians navigate the world of library grants. Hundreds of grants are available to libraries of all types from local foundations, family trusts, small and large corporations, professional organizations, and the publishing community.

The Library Grants Center is divided into three main sections:

- **National Library Grants** - Search and browse grants and awards available to all libraries by category, purpose, deadline, and more.
- **State Library Grants** - Use the clickable U.S. map to open up your state's page and get information on how public funds are used in your state as well as what local foundations support libraries in your city, county, or region.
- **Library Grants: How-To** - Navigate the intricacies of the grant application process by taking a quick tour, browsing an extensive (and interactive) list of Frequently Asked Questions, or browsing the various lists of Resources like books, web sites, newsletters, blogs, and more to enhance your grant education.

National Archives to Release 1940 Census Online

The National Archives today **announced** its **National Archives** selection of Inflection (parent company of **to Release 1940 Archives.com**) to design and host a free web **Census Free Online** site for the April 2, 2012 launch of the 1940 U.S. Census. This is very significant for sociologists, demographers, historians, political scientists and genealogists because it will mark the first time that the National Archives has released a U.S. Census online. On April 2, 2012, users will be able to search, browse, and download the 1940 Census schedules.

For the release of the 1940 Census online, the National Archives has digitized the entire census, creating more than 3.8 million digital images of census schedules, maps, and enumeration district descriptions.
