The Newton County Public Library successfully migrated to Evergreen Indiana on Tuesday, November 22, 2011. The library district serves a population of 9,243 and has three branches in Lake Village (main branch), Morocco and Roselawn.

With the addition of NCPL, Evergreen Indiana now serves a population of 862,333 and includes 96 libraries.

Evergreen Indiana will also be upgrading software to Evergreen 2.1 beginning at 8:00 AM on Friday, December 9 until Sunday, December 11 at 8:00 PM. This new version features enhanced security settings and circulation features as well as increased functionality.
