## 1865: Christmas at the soldiers' home



Christmas 1865 was the first at home for many veterans following the Civil War. Many of them had changed, and their families did not recognize their undiagnosed trauma. The desire for normalcy and compassion made the holiday a poignant benchmark, and scenes about town were reminiscent of Dickens' vignettes. These were recalled In the Indianapolis Daily Herald newspaper.

Editor Samuel Perkins witnessed abundant nativity celebrations and observed that each veteran had returned to his church, where the celebration might "render him additionally devout and thankful." Despite commotion, "there was less of the pyrotechnical exhibitions on the street than usual, and we were glad of it." Holiday fireworks had been common, but in 1865 veterans were peculiarly exempt from such triggering influences.

Stevens, of the Ninth Regiment Hancock Corps" where they had "a sumptuous repast." Music was provided "by the regimental string band," and Perkins glibly recalled that "it was far in the morning of the 26th before the gorgeous assemblage dispersed." He waxed poetic:

"Life cannot be one long gala day ... humanity, which ... relaxed from the jostle of business day before yesterday, has again settled down into the dull task-work of everyday life... The earth will have to make another annual cycle before St. Nicholas will return to us... May the twenty-fifth of December, 1866, find us surrounded by as many blessings as the Christmas which has but just come and gone."
