InfoExpress renewal submissions now being accepted



InfoExpress renewal submissions are now being accepted for the 2023-24 service year. This year's renewal deadline is June 1, but participants will have until July 31 to submit payment.

For the 2023-24 service year, the subsidized annual subscription cost to libraries for one day of service per week will be \$370. This subsidy is limited to one library per system. Branches are not eligible for this subsidy, nor are corporate libraries or public libraries not meeting standards. The cost for non-subsidized libraries is \$980

A 2% late surcharge will be added to payments postmarked after Sunday, July 31. Service will be suspended effective Monday, Aug. 1 if the full payment is not submitted by July 31. The 2023-24 service year runs from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

Beginning in July 2023, courier service will be provided by Pillow Logistics out of Indianapolis. The Indiana State Library will communicate updates regarding the transition, including which week the new courier will provide service. In advance of this, the courier will also conduct a test run in June to familiarize themselves with the locations and to introduce themselves. With these new routes, libraries may see a change to their usual delivery window. Please notify the Indiana State Library if there are any missed days or service concerns.

Click <u>here</u> to sign in and renew. Renewals must be submitted before June 1 to ensure continuation of service.

School libraries are on a modified timeline to accommodate the academic calendar. School renewal requests should be submitted by Sept. 1, and payment is due by Sept. 30 to avoid the suspension of service as of Oct. 1 and a 2% surcharge.

The Indiana State Library and the Indy Arts Council have partnered to create an exhibit detailing the railway experience in the Hoosier state. Titled "Passengers: The Indiana Railway Experience," the exhibit will be on display at the Indianapolis International Airport in Concourse A and B until July 17.

Potentially viewed by more than a million travelers, the exhibit includes maps, posters, photographs and ephemera that provide a snapshot of the passenger experience at the height of rail travel. Registration now open for 2023 ILF Annual Conference, new venue announced



Registration is now open for the 2023 Indiana Library Federation Annual Conference. This year, on Nov. 12-14, the conference will take place at the Crowne Plaza Downtown Union Station in downtown Indianapolis.

The <u>Crowne Plaza</u> is a historic hotel that offers over 55,000 square feet of event space for up to 2,500 people. The Grand Hall Ballroom features stunning wheel windows and a barrel ceiling of original stained glass. Walk back in time and encounter remnants of World War I, such as the wheel windows that were blacked out to disguise them during the war and still appear grey-tinted today.

The hotel is located near attractions such the Canal Walk, the Indianapolis Zoo, the Indiana Statehouse, the Indiana State Museum and the NCAA Hall of Champions.

Early bird registration is currently open and will run through Aug. 27. Early bird rates are \$260 for ILF members, \$275 for non-members businesses throughout the state. It also hosts the annual <u>Centennial</u> <u>Business Awards</u> for Indiana.

An additional award program is the <u>Hoosier Homestead Award</u>, which has awarded Centennial, Sesquicentennial, and Bicentennial Awards for Indiana farms operating within the same family for 100 years or more.
