families in Hoosier communities called Indiana SUN Bucks. While most eligible children and families will automatically be enrolled to receive the program's benefits, some who are not automatically enrolled may find that they need help applying for the program.

IDOE anticipates that families may visit their local library seeking assistance with the application. In order to prepare library staff for potential questions, IDOE would like to share details about the program.

Funded by USDA and the State of Indiana, Indiana SUN Bucks is a new and permanent benefit program that provides families \$120 per eligible school-aged child to buy groceries while school is out for the summer. School-aged children from households that receive SNAP, TANF or some income-based Medicaid benefits, or are foster, homeless or migrant are eligible. Children attending a school that implements the National School Lunch Program - whose household income meets income guidelines for free or reduced-price meals - are also eligible.

Households that were approved for free or reduced-price meals during the school year will be automatically approved for SUN Bucks. Only those that did not apply for benefits during the school year or those attending schools that operate the Community Eligibility Provision and are not receiving SNAP, TANF or certain levels of income-based Medicaid will need to complete the state's online SUN Bucks application.

Households will receive a separate EBT card loaded with \$120 for each eligible child. These cards can be used anywhere that SNAP benefits are accepted. The application will be open all summer and cards will be
