Library patrons can visit a [dedicated mobile passport landing page](#) where they can sign-up for the passport by providing their name, email address and mobile phone number. A link is then sent to their mobile phone, which opens the passport and directs the user to add the button icon to their home screen. There is never anything to download and no bulky apps take up space on a user's phone. On the landing page, click the Learn More button to see all of the libraries on the passport. Once downloaded, participants then use the location services on their phones to check in to participating libraries once per week.

In addition to the returning quarterly prize drawing for participants who check in to libraries on the passport trail, this year, passport users will have an opportunity to claim a limited-edition Indiana Library Passport mug. When users check into a library, they will be awarded 100 points. Once a user earns 2,000 points, they can redeem those points for the mug, while supplies last.

Also new this year, users will now be able to see the distance from their current location to any library on the passport. Additionally, a new advanced filtering option lets passport holders sort by name and by libraries near them. Carnegie libraries are also filtered out as special attractions. Finally, the passport now displays the weather of a user's current location.

Please note that the previous version of the Indiana Library Passport will be retired on May 8 as the new version launches. Current passport holders will need to sign up for the new version of the Indiana Library Passport on or after May 8, as their information

## Annual opening of the Lincoln Pioneer Village and Museum



Celebrating the annual May opening of the Lincoln Pioneer Village and Museum in Rockport offers an opportunity to remember the original opening day celebration of the historic memorial in May of 1951. Commemorating the site where Abraham Lincoln's youthful days were spent, this historic village and museum have served over 70 years now providing the public with information about one of Indiana's - and the country's - most memorable figures. During the events of the original celebration, another Indiana native would also be represented. George Honig, a Rockford native artist, was commemorated as the creator of the Lincoln Pioneer Village's memorial tablet.

Throughout the original opening celebration, there were costumed "pioneers" to help introduce and teach visitors all about the site, a tradition that they have carried on to today giving the site a touch of the past that's tangible to visitors.

### ACPL shares 2022 Community Impact Report



The Allen County Public Library has released its [2022 Community Impact Report](#). The report, which utilizes data from the library's annual report to the Indiana State Library, reflects how the library system's services and collection contributed to the education, literacy, access and discovery in Allen County over the past year.

In 2022, the library saw a 7.8% increase in number of library visits for a total of nearly 1.5 million visits across the system's 14 locations. Borrowing was up as well with a 12% increase over 2021 for a total of 4.1 million items borrowed. The library also put concerted effort into addressing the digital divide through access to high-quality Wi-Fi in its branches. The resulting 1,035,476 Wi-Fi sessions equated to a 20% increase over 2021.

"Every day, we know we are having an impact, but when we take a moment to really dig into the numbers and compare that impact year over year, it gives us an opportunity to hold ourselves accountable," said executive director Susan Baier. "Our work will never be done, but to see such growth in a year gives us something to celebrate and reminds us of the

### ALA Great Stories Club applications due May 10



Grant applications are now open for inclusion in a brand new Great Stories Club theme, "Imagining Tomorrow: Building Inclusive Futures," from the American Library Association.

The series will feature science fiction books that explore questions of equity, identity and alternate futures. The club is a thematic reading and discussion program that engages teens who are facing difficult challenges through literature-based library outreach programs.

Applications will be accepted from all types of libraries - public, school, academic and special - in the United States. Thirty-five libraries will be selected to receive 11 paperback copies of theme-related books to use in the reading and discussion groups, as well as a \$500 programming stipend, online training, an array of program resources and support. critical needs we fill in Allen County.”

Among the most impressive growth was in the area of library programming which was offered both on-site at library branches and off-site at community outreach events. In 2022, the library served nearly 95,000 attendees in more than 5,000 programs. This is a 62% increase in participation and a 328% increase in offerings over 2021.

An additional item of note is the success of the ACPL’s new Rolland Center for Lincoln Research which opened in January 2022. The interactive space showcases the Library’s impressive collection of Abraham Lincoln artifacts and welcomed more than 20,000 visitors in its first year.
