# **Science Kits for Public Libraries**

The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers Region 4's Science Kits for Public Libraries Grant program is offering up to \$2,000 in funding to public libraries to establish a circulating science kits collection. Libraries must be located within Region 4, which includes all of Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota, Wisconsin and northerly portions of Indiana, Illinois, Ohio, Nebraska and South Dakota.

The application form is now available on the SKPL website and library submissions will be accepted until Jan. 16, 2025. Libraries that have previously applied for the grant, but did not receive funding, are invited to submit again.

Public libraries have a long tradition of building stronger communities by providing life long learning opportunities for children and teens. The SKPL Team is honored to have the opportunity to enrich the services that public libraries offer. SKPL enables children, parents and teachers the chance to borrow library kits for hands-on STEM learning at home or in the classroom.

The Ohio Valley Group of Technical Services Librarians has announced that its 2025 conference will take place on May 15-16 at the Cunningham Memorial Library at Indiana State University in Terre Haute. The Conference Program Committee is now accepting program proposals for the conference.

The purpose of the <u>organization</u> is to provide an opportunity to gather together for the interchange of ideas and discussion of issues in library and archive technical services; to form a united group with the aim to keep in touch with movements in the field of technical services; and to cooperate with other library organizations with similar goals.

Technical service departments are responsible for managing and organizing processes that ensure library collections are cataloged, classified and accessible to users. Unlike other aspects of librarianship, technical service work is often invisible despite being paramount to the success of library users. At the 2025 Ohio Valley Group of Technical Services Librarians Conference, the Conference Program Committee wishes to shed light on unseen work and discuss the impact of technical services by examining best practices, resource management, emerging technology and more.

The committee invites forward thinking submissions in all areas related to technical services librarianship including acquisitions, cataloging, serials, metadata, open access initiatives, electronic resources and preservation in academic, public and special libraries. Participants are encouraged to think about the importance of technical services work and its impact throughout libraries and communities alike.

Proposals are due by Jan. 15, 2025. Time slots for all sessions are 50 minutes, including time for questions from the audience. Submissions for presentations, panel discussions, lightning rounds, workshops, and other formats are welcome.

# SPEAK 2025 author lineup announced by Evansville Vanderburgh Public



Last month, the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library concluded its 2024 SPEAK series with a presentation by bestselling author Victoria Christopher Murray. The library has now announced the author lineup for the SPEAK 2025 series: Kwame Alexander, Timothy Egan, Angela Jackson-Brown and Ralph Shayne.

"The authors selected for SPEAK 2025 encourage us to reflect on our individual and shared pasts," said Erika Qualls Barnett, programming manager at the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library.

The first author in the series, Timothy Egan, will speak on Wednesday, March 19, 2025 at 7 p.m. at First Presbyterian Church in downtown Evansville. Egan's most recent book. "A Fever in the Heartland: The Ku Klux Klan's Plot to Take Over America, and the Woman Who Stopped Them," is a New York Times bestseller.

Ralph Shayne, author of "Hour of Need," will present at Victory Theatre on Wednesday, April 16, 2025 at 7 p.m. His graphic novel pays tribute to heroes who saved the Danish Jews during the Holocaust.

Angela Jackson-Brown, an awardwinning writer, poet and playwright who is also an Associate Professor in the Creative Writing program at Indiana University, will speak on Saturday, June 21, 2025 at 2 p.m. at the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library Central Branch. Some of her best-known works include "When Stars Rain Down" and "The Light Always Breaks."

The series will conclude with Kwame Alexander, a poet, educator, publisher, Emmy® Award-winning producer and #1 New York Times bestselling author of 40 books. Alexander will present on Thursday, Oct. 2, 2025 at 7 p.m. at Victory Theatre. Some of Alexander's best known works include "This Is The Honey," "Why Fathers Cry At Night," "An American Story," "The Door of No Return," "Becoming Muhammad Ali" and "Rebound."
