### FDLP transitioning to digital program



The Federal Depository Library Program is moving to become a digital program. What does that mean? The Government Publishing Office will reduce the number of printed titles delivered to Federal depository libraries. The content previously available on print will still be accessible, principally through the GovInfo website. The quantity of copies to be available to depository libraries falls into three categories:

- Unlimited distribution titles will be distributed at current selection quantities and include the U.S. Code, Statutes at Large, U.S. Reports, Constitution of the United States (Analysis & Interpretation, including supplements), House and Senate Journals and Bound Congressional Record Index.
- 20-copy titles include Serial (both the bound version and related individual House and Senate Reports and Documents), Bound Congressional Record, Senate Executive Journal and select maps.
- 50-copy titles include all other titles on the PDT list.

Neutral: How to Champion the Right to Read," presented by Angela Hursh. This is a twohour live workshop version of the <u>online course</u> that is available to libraries and consortiums.

In this course, attendees will learn how to clarify their library's policies, solidify their library's positions and clearly communicate their library's mission, vision and values. Participants will also learn tactics to use to rally community and stakeholder support and how to handle communications should your library be the focus of a book challenge.

Core skills covered in this course include:

- Concrete tips for strengthening the public's perception of the library now, including tips on how to promote their mission, vision, and values, the policies they create to protect intellectual freedom and their place in the community as a safe and welcoming space.
- Strategies for publicly responding to a censorship challenge, including media relations, crafting talking points and communicating with patrons.
- Successful promotional ideas from real-life libraries designed to educate and empower readers about the threat of book challenges and rally library supporters all year long.

Hursh leads an outstanding team of marketing and training professionals at NoveList, a company dedicated to helping libraries reach readers.

In addition to "No More Neutral," there will also be two afternoon sessions. One with Carey LaBella of the Vigo County Public Library and Julie Wendorf of the Crown Point Public Library - members of the Indiana Library Federation's Intellectual Freedom Committee - and a roundtable discussion. There will be four LEU's available for Indiana library staff.

There will be a lunch break with a box lunch available for purchase, or attendees may bring their own lunch. Registration is limited. Cost for the day is \$30, plus the box lunch cost of either \$10 or \$12. Click <a href="here">here</a> to register.
