## Nonfiction read-a-likes for fiction lovers

The Music Section of the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (NLS), part of the Library of Congress, houses more than 25,000 titles, including braille and large-print scores and recorded instructional materials about music and musicians. It is the largest accessible collection of its kind in the world. Music-related magazines in audio and braille are also available. The music section does not offer recreational listening music, only educational music materials.

While patrons in Indiana receive most NLS services through the Indiana Talking Book and Braille Library, NLS music materials circulate directly to patrons from the NLS headquarters in Washington, D.C.

Any person eligible for NLS service is also eligible for NLS music services. Patrons already registered with the Indiana Talking Book and Braille Library and interested in receiving NLS music materials should contact the NLS Music Section directly, either via phone at 800-424-8567 ext. 2, or via email.
