I was an engineer at Detroit Edison for 4 ½ years before coming to MISO, with about 4 of those years spent in Transmission Planning. The ½ year was spent in a time-of-day pricing pilot program.

I came to the Midwest ISO in November, 2001, as a Senior Engineer in Transmission Expansion Planning. First, I was responsible for performing calculations on the Loss Matrix and helping to build the processes used for Transmission Service Request and Interconnection Request evaluations. Later I was full-time on the Generator Interconnection processes, becoming the Technical Lead in that group in the summer of 2003. Then in the October, 2004, I became the Manager of the Transmission Service Planning group, responsible for the processing the transmission service request queue. As of January, 2007, I'm the Senior Manager of Transmission Access Planning responsible for the Transmission Service and Generator Interconnection queues. This is the result of merging the two groups in January, 2007.
