II. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the agenda, as amended.

IV. PERSONAL APPEARANCES

A. Kimberly Grande, LMFT Applicant

Ms. Grande appeared before the board to express her concerns with the LMFT application process.

Ms. Grande stated that the process was longer than she anticipated.

The Board informed Ms. Grande that her application would be reviewed and allowed her to take the jurisprudence exam.

B. Natalie Joy Newlin, License #33003726

Ms. Newlin appeared before the board to request the reinstatement of her expired license to practice social work. Ms. Newlin informed the Board that she has worked as a service

coordinator for First Steps for the past 3-years. She further stated that her work as a service coordinator does not require a license.

If reinstated, Ms. Newlin stated that she plans to remain in her current position.

A motion was made and seconded to renew Ms. Newlin's license to practice social work in the State of Indiana.

C. Brad Kelley, LSW Applicant

Mr. Kelley appeared before the Board to discuss the positive responses on his LSW application. Mr. Kelley answered "yes" to the following questions:

"Are you now being, or have you ever been treated for drug or alcohol abuse?"

"Have you ever been convicted of, pled guilty or *nolo contender* to any misdemeanor or felony in any state?

The board questioned Mr. Kelley about his positive responses. Mr. Kelley stated that the events occurred during his 1st year of graduate school and he has not consumed alcohol since his last arrest on April 10, 2008. He further stated that he is currently working in chemical dependency counseling.

During his probation Mr. Kelley informed the Board that he went through fourteen (14) weeks of treatment and the mothers against drunk driving program. He further stated that he has been sober since October 2007.

The board questioned Mr. Kelley about the mechanisms he has put in place to combat his choices for alcohol. He stated that he did not use substances to cope; he believed that he just made bad choices.

A motion was made and seconded to approve Mr. Kelley's application pending receipt of a letter from his probationary officers affirming that he has completed his probationary requirements, in both Hancock County and Ohio, including the dates his driver's license was suspended in Ohio.

A. In the Matter of Elizabeth A. Aguayo

Administrative Cause No. 2009 BHSB 003

Re: ALJ Recommended

Case Summary: Ms. Aguayo appeared before the board to appeal the denial of her application to practice clinical social work in the State of Indiana.

Ms. Aguayo's application was denied as a result of her course not meeting the psychopathology requirement.

Ms. Aguayo presented evidence of a new course to meet the psychopathology requirement. The board accepted the exhibit without objection.

The Board reviewed the exhibit and questioned Ms. Aguayo about the course to determine whether it met the psychopathology requirement.
