She is with PET Radiopharmacy, Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri and they are requesting a waiver to allow the research Radiopharmaceutical, 18F-fluoroestradiol (FES) to be delivered to Indiana School of Medicine from PET Radiopharmacy. They are want to provide the drug for research on breast cancer.

James Fletcher, M.D., FACR, FSNMMI, Professor of Radiology and Imaging Services Director, Indiana University (IIBIS) Cancer Imaging Center; Director, Nuclear Medicine: Molecular Imaging & Therapeutics wrote a letter to the Board regarding the waiver.

PET Radiopharmacy at Washington University is licensed as an FDA manufacturer in Missouri and has inspections by the Illinois Board of Pharmacy and the FDA every two (2) years.

In February 2016 he appeared before the Medical Licensing Board regarding his renewal application. The Medical Board renewed it on active status.

In September 2014, the Hospital reinstated him with monthly drug testing and monthly INSPECT report monitoring of his prescribing as requirements of the reinstatement.

No criminal charges were filed. He no longer treats his family in any way. He has also completed three (3) continuing education hours in pain medication.

Mr. Damon indicated that Dr. Haase is a champion leader at the hospital and a fantastic physician. He began working at Kosciusko Community Hospital on September 1, 2014 after he surrendered his DEA registration.

He was employed on an Employment Reinstatement Agreement that will be in effect until his DEA registration is restored. This agreement required that he not treat any family members, random urine drug screens, and he must print off his INSPECT reports for review.

Ms. Waire testified that she was the case analyst that investigated this matter.

Educational Outreach:

- The State Medical Association included in their monthly publication and article on INSPECT Integration initiative.
- Met with representatives from IU Health Blackford Hospital and the Blackford County Department of Health to discuss the number of opioid prescriptions being dispensed to Blackford residents. IU Health Blackford is interested in taking a proactive approach to addressing the number of prescriptions being written and dispensed in their County and INSPECT will be helping to support that effort.

MPH:

- MPH has completed the INSPECT dashboard in Tableau. The dashboard is currently available to individuals within State Government. It displays interactive features that allows users to search opioid prescription dispensation rates and annual trends in Indiana. The data sets are de-identified and information cannot be downloaded or shared without permission from the INSPECT Administrator.
- Kara has been working with MPH over the last month to develop an interactive map for the integration initiative. The map will feature pins that are dropped in the locations of newly integrated facilities.

NABP:

- NABP has submitted their proposal to State PDMP Administrators for the development of a central repository to collect and store suspicious order reports.
Immediate Ask:
 1. Illinois, Ohio, and Michigan will take the lead in calling for NABP to serve as a central repository for Suspicious Orders from wholesalers that are required to be reported to the DEA and state boards.
 2. NABP will assemble a stakeholder group of wholesale distributors, DEA, and other interested state boards of pharmacy to establish with Illinois, Michigan, and Ohio the basic parameters of the Suspicious Orders report and other significant details
 3. NABP will work with stakeholders on the development of a suspicious order reporting system to facilitate the uniform reporting from wholesale distributors and to state boards of pharmacy. The system will have the flexibility to accommodate additional state-specific reporting requirements.

AWARxE:

November releases to include the following features:

- Annual Delegate Re-verification – this enhancement was created for a state in which delegates are required to be re-verified annually by their delegating supervisors. This re-verification process relies on the delegating supervisor to make the determination as to whether a delegate is active or inactive for the purposes of re-verification.
- DEA Reverification Enhancement – in addition to the current DEA validation process, additional checks can be enabled during the reverification process. In addition to checking that the DEA is available in the DEA reference file, additional checks will be performed to verify that the DEA number is active, the expiration date is in the future, and the DEA number matches to the prescriber.
- Prescription Written/Fill Date Validation Enhancements – Clearinghouse will now generate errors for prescriptions that have:
 - A fill date in the future
 - A written date in the future
 - A fill date that occurs before the prescriptions written date

INSPECT Integration Initiative:
