VI. Education

1. Ball State University - request for substantive change to BSN curriculum – Karrie Osborne PhD, RN

Dr. Karrie Osborne appeared on behalf of the program. Education Compliance Officer Toni Herron informed the Board that Ball State University (BSU) was requesting approval for a

substantive change that includes an addition of three (3) nursing courses to the BSN curriculum. A change to the BSU curriculum opened 6 credits that could be used differently. A three (3) credit Medical Terminology is being added to the second semester of the program. A two (2) credit course, Career Exploration and Academic Alignment, will be added to the first semester and a one (1) credit course, Career Readiness and Planning will be added to the fourth semester. Dr. Osborne stated that added coursework occurs prior to or early within the curriculum and does not alter progression requirements. The change is slated to begin with incoming freshman in the Fall of 2027. Board member Kim Cooper moved to approve the substantive change request and Board member Dr. Julian Gallegos seconded. Motion carries 7-0-0.

2. Trine University – request for substantive change for ASN curriculum – Angel Jennings PhD, MSN, RN

Dr. Angel Jennings, Dr. Susan Rasmussen and Amy Bortner appeared on behalf of the program. Education Compliance Officer Toni Herron informed the board that Trine is requesting a substantive change for the ASN track to change student learning objectives to match AACN and NLN criteria. The metrics are different but more clear and reinforced instruction. A motion was made and seconded to approve the practice ready request. Cooper/Scalf 7-0-0.

Trine is requesting a substantive change for the ASN track to increase credit hours in core nursing classes to provide additional instructional and experiential learning. The courses proposed are Fundamentals of Nursing; Adult Health I and II, and Maternal Newborn Nursing. The desired change came from student feedback and faculty input. Ms. Cooper asked how many had completed the program. Dr. Jennings stated that three (3) had finished and passed NCLEX and ten (10) students remained to test. Ms. Cooper stated that this was evidence of credit creep with a very small sample on which to make the changes. After further discussion, the program chose to withdraw the request.

Dr. Amanda Leffler and Dr. Samantha Cussen and Rachel Day appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. Herron stated that this was another current University of St. Francis campus that was requesting to add the Leffler Academy @ University of St. Francis Practical Nursing track. The goal is to begin this track in Fall 2026. Ms. Herron stated that the facilities have capacity to start a PN track. Ms. Herron stated that some communication challenges were identified during the site visit, and an opportunity to share changes to the program – with the adoption of the “Leffler” curriculum – currently were being addressed.

The request was made to revise NUR201 Introduction to Psych, currently taught by nursing faculty, to Human Growth and Development a 100-level course taught by general education faculty. Accept pending the provision of syllabi within 10 business days of board meeting.

4. Leffler Academy at University of St. Francis – Intent to Open PN program Lafayette site visit report – Dr. Amanda Leffler- **CONTINUED**
5. VicTory Training Intent to Open PN program initial accreditation site visit – Regina Beard RN

Dr. Regina Beard, Ms. Scully, Ms. Nalls, and Ms. Westbrook appeared on behalf of the program. Education Compliance Officer Shawn Keep stated that VicTory Training was appearing to request initial accreditation to open a Practical Nursing program in Hobart.

Ms. Keep introduced the program's strengths and weaknesses. The program had strong support from Hobart High School to expand its current healthcare pathways. VicTory Training had established a Practical Nursing-appropriate simulation and skills lab equipped with hospital-donated beds, lab resources, manikins, and simulation equipment. The long-term care clinical site was considered a good opportunity for students. St. Mary's Hospital was possibly willing to provide medical-surgical clinical placements; however, hospital administration was not aware of the need for clinicals outside of medical-surgical prior to the site visit. Major areas of concern included faculty responsibilities, as many instructors had multiple roles outside of VicTory Training, potentially limiting the time they could devote to the program. The schedule presented unclear authority over the program depending on whether students were adult learners or high school students. The budget was ambiguous for the same reason; if students were adult learners, sponsors might assist, otherwise tuition was listed as either \$15,000 or \$16,000 in two different places.

Clinical site concerns were also noted. No adequate pediatric site was available during the site visit; afterward, the program reported a site in Illinois, but the only faculty with Illinois licenses were not listed as teaching pediatric clinicals. The mental health clinical site was deemed inadequate, with only two patients present during the site visit, and the mental health clinic was preparing to move to a new location soon afterward.

Curriculum alignment issues were identified, including conflicting curriculum pathways and unclear instructional hours. Admissions policies showed unclear admission criteria, inconsistent tuition information, and limited advising space. Faculty qualifications revealed no pediatric faculty listed in the Faculty Matrix and only two faculty members holding Illinois licenses—neither with pediatric experience—despite the only pediatric clinical site being in Illinois. Dr. Beard responded that the program intended to operate two tracks: a daytime track for high school students and an evening track for community learners. The evening track was termed a community track because high school students might choose to attend if their parents paid for it. VicTory Training had multiple community partnerships and several organizations prepared to sponsor students, either in the daytime or evening track. Dr. Beard explained that a pediatric clinical site had been obtained and provided a letter from the site administrator. She added that Ms. Creola Henderson had agreed to serve as a pediatric instructor and mentor current faculty. Ms. Scully addressed concerns regarding the mental health clinical site, noting that the facility was preparing to move and had several departments—intensive outpatient, pediatric day programming, adult day programming, and crisis management—where students would rotate. Dr. Beard added that the program would operate Monday through Friday. The daytime track would run from 7:45 a.m. to 11:45 a.m., and the evening/community track from 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Both tracks would contain 394 instructional hours and cover identical content. Ms. Cooper asked for the name of the Illinois site and what steps had been taken to facilitate student clinicals there. Dr. Beard stated they had secured the site and contacted the superintendent. When Ms. Cooper asked whether VicTory Training had applied to the Illinois

State Board of Nursing, Dr. Beard stated they had not. Ms. Cooper clarified that such an application was required for any out-of-state program seeking clinical placements in Illinois. A discussion followed between Dr. Beard and Ms. Cooper regarding clinical requirements. Dr. King discussed the possibility of returning in an ALJ-type setting to give the program an opportunity to withdraw its petition so it could address missing elements. Dr. King asked whether the 90-day requirement had been waived, and Ms. Keep confirmed that it had. Dr. King also noted grammatical errors and issues with VicTory Training's emails and phone numbers. He asked Dr. Beard whether she intended to withdraw the petition. Dr. Beard stated that withdrawal was not her preference, but she would proceed. The petition to open the program was withdrawn by Dr. Beard.

Ms. Herron stated that the clarification requested by the Board was included in the response that is in the Board packet. Issues regarding immunization vs. vaccination policy, progression policy, use of ATI, Title IX policy and process, stop outs and satisfactory time for completion were provided through links in the response. After discussion, Ms. Cooper made a motion to grant initial accreditation with a total of twenty (20) students per year. The program may decide how/if they want to appropriate that number. Board member Dr. Daniel Hayden seconded the motion. Motion carries 7-0-0.
