VI. Education

1. Leffler Academy at University of St. Francis – Intent to Open PN program Lafayette site visit report – Dr. Amanda Leffler, DNP, RN and Samantha Cussen, EdD, PhD, RN, CNE

Dr. Amanda Leffler DNP, RN and Dr. Samantha Cussen EdD, PhD, RN, CNE appeared on behalf of the program. Education Compliance Officer Toni Herron stated that the Lafayette location for the Leffler Academy at University of St. Francis (LA@USF-Lafayette) was the final location to seek initial accreditation for the Practical Nursing (PN) degree. Ms. Herron reminded the Board that University of St. Francis purchased the assets of Leffler Academy and has added the PN track to their nursing programs currently offered at the Fort Wayne and Crown Point locations. The Board previously granted initial accreditation to the PN tracks for Gas City (original location) 11/19/2020; Fort Wayne campus 5/21/2026; and Crown Point campus 6/18/2026. While the site visit for Initial Accreditation for the Lafayette campus was conducted on 5/26/2026, the program was advised that due to the elevator in the building being out of operation, the site visitors recommended that the request for accreditation be delayed until the elevator was operational. At the time of the site visit, no faculty had been hired for this location either. The proposed curriculum is the same as that taught at all other PN locations with good results at the original Gas City campus. LA@USF-Lafayette has provided evidence that both of those issues have been remedied. Otis Elevator Co. has provided a Letter of Operation and Dr. Leffler provided evidence that qualified, credentialed faculty have been hired. Campus leadership for the program was identified also.

During discussion, Board member Kim Cooper asked about the program length. She stated that the requirement for PN program length, as identified in statute, is twelve (12) months and the program can configure the number of weeks in a semester as suits the program and students best. LA@UISF-Lafayette is requesting an initial admission of two (2) cohorts annually consisting of thirty (30) students each. **Ms. Cooper made a motion to approve the request for initial accreditation with two (2) cohorts annually of thirty (30) students each. Ms. Cooper said that the mitigating factors to approve this larger than usual request include demonstrated program success as evaluated by NCLEX results at the Gas City campus where the program began; consistent strong leadership; qualified faculty; financial resources to support the number requested; strong student retention and quality clinical sites. Board member Dr. Emily Sego seconded. Motion carries 9-0-0.**

2. Caris College – Construction site visit report- Dr. Carissa Jury, RN, BSN, MSNML, CEN, EdD
Need updated names on who attended meeting.

Mr. Bruce Kepley and Ms. Michelle Smith appeared on behalf of the program. Dr. Carissa Jury couldn't attend. Shawn Keep, Education Compliance Officer, presented the program to the Board. Caris College is presenting to obtain approval to use their newly constructed lab and classrooms. They are also presenting for a one-year follow-up on their ASN program. Ms. Keep stated to the Board that Caris recently completed construction to make additional space for the ASN and PN students. They created a newly designed simulation lab and redesigned three classrooms, and a student lounge. The board indicated a couple areas of concern, only having two beds for simulation may not be enough without reconfiguring the space and concerns about lack

of debriefing room. Ms. Cooper asked about the new construction regarding how many beds. Discussion occurred about how many students around the beds and which mannequins they had. They also discussed the budget, items in the lab such as cribs, isolette, the cost of the lab, upgraded AV equipment, and who will be teaching the simulation. The board made recommendations to consider simulation for other areas of curriculum. **Ms. Cooper made a motion to approve the construction; Ms. Morris seconded the motion. Ms. Cooper stated the following mitigating factors: purchased high-end equipment, and they have a line item on the budget to handle current and future expenses. Motion carries 9-0-0.**

3. Caris College – One year follow up visit ASN initial accreditation- Dr. Carissa Jury, RN, BSN, MSNML, CEN, EdD-

Mr. Bruce Kepley and Ms. Michelle Smith appeared on behalf of the program. Dr. Carissa Jury couldn't attend. Shawn Keep, Education Compliance Officer, presented the program to the Board. Caris College is presenting for a one-year follow-up on their ASN program. Caris indicated a plan to open both a traditional ASN as well as LPN to ASN transition track. At the time of initial accreditation, the Board identified the entry tracks are different for each and they would need to return with a new request to open. Ms. Cooper discussed the dress code policy that needs to match with practice. Mr. Kepley stated they can clean that up. Ms. Cooper asked about the curriculum. Mr. Kepley stated the Dr. Jury would need to speak about that. Ms. Cooper stated she has questions about the transition piece. Ms. Cooper asked if NUR210 or 110 is the first RN or ASN nursing course. Ms. Smith answered it was 110. Ms. Smith stated there is a foundations and a fundamentals course. Ms. Cooper asked if that policy is in the handbook. Ms. Smith indicated she doesn't have the handbook in front of her. Ms. Cooper also asked about how many credits the LPN would be getting credit for in the transfer. Ms. Smith indicated it would be 25. There was more discussion regarding transfer courses.

After discussion, Ms. Cooper states it appears there is a transition program afoot. The board has concerns that questions are not being answered adequately due to Dr. Jury being absent. Ms. Racine, Director of ISBN, directed the board to table the One-year follow-up visit to allow Dr. Jury to be present. Ms. Racine clarified that Caris College is on the agenda twice, one for construction and the one year follow up. Ms. Racine asked if the board could move forward with the construction site visit and then table the one-year site visit and have them back on the agenda in September. Ms. Smith stated that would be perfect because Dr. Jury will be back from maternity leave.

The board decided to TABLE this matter and Caris will be rescheduled for September board meeting.

4. VicTory Training Intent to Open PN program initial accreditation site visit – Dr. Regina Beard, DNP, RN

Dr. Regina Beard and Donnita Scully, RN appeared on behalf of the program. Shawn Keep, Education Compliance Officer presented the program to the Board. Victory Training is presenting for the second time requesting initial accreditation for their PN program in Hobart, Indiana. Last month the Board discussed clinical sites and found they were not acceptable, so the discussion did not go much beyond that. After Ms. Keep gave a quick overall of the program, Ms. Scully stated they would be using ATI for entrance into the program. They will use UWorld

throughout the program. There was a brief discussion regarding the different tracts, especially Anatomy. They are conflicting depending on if the student has already taken anatomy prior to the program. Ms. Cooper stated her biggest concern was not having the full packet until yesterday. Dr. Beard apologized and stated the master link hasn't been updated for a while and they can just go there and open it. Ms. Cooper stated she had concerns with at least six items from the handbook. She did not have time to review the handbook when she only had it for twenty-four hours. **Ms. Cooper made a motion to table the discussion and listed supporting factors in the time frame the Board received the documentation. Volume of questions and concerns the board had from last month. Ms. Cooper also identified that the education team needs to go out and complete the site visit for the Peds recommendations. Motion made by Ms. Cooper and was seconded by Dr. Sego. Motion carries 8-0-0.**

5. Fortis College Teachout final report

Michelle Oddi PhD, MSN, RN, CNE; Pam Pratt BA,BSN,RN and Jose Davilla appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. Herron stated that Fortis had submitted the final closeout report for the ADN program. The report list that the four active students had completed the program. Of the total of eighteen (18) 2026 graduates, 6 have tested and 12 remain to test. The NCLEX pass rate for 2026 is 33% (6 of 18). Ms. Herron stated that Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (PLA) will continue to track NCLEX results for Fortis College graduates. Mr. Davila added that graduates can contact the school at any time for additional assistance in preparing to take NCLEX. Ms. Cooper asked if there was anything else that the PLA required of Fortis. Ms. Herron stated that they just need to know how to direct students to get copies of their transcripts should they need them in the future. **Ms. Cooper directed Mr. Davila to submit that information to IPLA/ISBN. Ms. Cooper made a motion to accept the closeout report for the ADN track at Fortis College. Board member Dr. Daniel Hayden seconded. Motion carries 8-0-0.**
