Settlement proposes an indefinite probation. The Board asked Zaneta to testify about the failed inspections. Board stated that it would be irresponsible to allow the Respondent to compound if the remodel is incomplete. Board does not feel comfortable accepting the Settlement agreement. Respondent stated that they are not compounding. Zaneta does not agree that no compounding has been occurring. The Respondent had no questions for Zaneta. State argued that the proposed settlement agreement addresses the concerns the Board expressed. Respondent's attorney repeated that he believed no compounding was occurring and that there was confusion about the remodel application. The Board discussed requiring another inspection by NABP or Gates occur in addition to the required environmental test reports. The Board agreed to Table the matter until Respondent's counsel could check with owner. Respondent expressed concerns about having an additional inspection and the status of their license renewal. Ultimately, the Respondent agreed to the additional settlement terms including an inspection by NABP. A personal appearance for the renewal will be set for April.

Brooksville Pharmaceuticals Inc. - Non-Resident Pharmacy Renewal Positive Response

Mike Gaerte, Terry Myers, and Philip Crooker in person to discuss the renewal positive response. Mike Gaerte provided an overview of the positive response. Ohio license was suspended. No longer compounds Retatrutide. \$250,000.00 fine. Ohio license was reinstated. In December Oregon issued a reciprocal action including a \$10,000.00 fine. In January, Florida issued an administrative complaint based upon Ohio's action. Received no FDA warning letters. Every state in which they are licensed in with a renewal were renewed. Did ship 51 Retatrutide products to Indiana. Retatrutide is a research compound only and not approved for commercial use or compounding. Florida is a blueprint state and has an inspection from them. The prescriptions were mostly written by local providers.

After discussion, the Board moved to RENEW the license and directed the Board Director to file a complaint with the OAG to include 51 counts.
