**Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact Implemented and Live in Indiana,  
Beginning Monday, March 9, 2026**

**Indianapolis, IN** – The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (IPLA) and the Indiana Occupational Therapy Committee (the Committee) are pleased to announce that the Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact (OT Compact) is now fully implemented and live in the state of Indiana, as of Monday, March 9, 2026. The OT Compact is an interstate agreement between member states to improve consumer access to occupational therapy services by reducing regulatory barriers to interstate mobility and cross-state practice of occupational therapy providers. The OT Compact was adopted in the state of Indiana under Senate Enrolled Act 73-2023, and its applicable regulations are provided in statute under [Indiana Code § 25-43](#).

Eligible occupational therapist (OT) and occupational therapist assistant (OTA) applicants may now apply for compact privilege(s) directly through the OT Compact. Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. You must hold a current, valid OT or OTA license in your home state of residence ([see flexibility for active-duty military and their spouses](#)).
2. You must have a valid United States Social Security Number or National Practitioner Identification number.
3. You cannot have any active encumbrance on any state license and must have paid all fines and completed all requirements resulting from disciplinary action against any license or compact privilege for a period of at least 2 years.
4. The state where you are seeking a compact privilege must be a member of the OT Compact and actively issuing and accepting compact privileges ([see map of compact states](#)).
5. You must pay all applicable fees, including the OT Compact Commission's privilege fee and the applicable member state's compact privilege fee ([see the list of state fees](#)).
6. If required, you must successfully complete the jurisprudence requirement/exam for the state(s) in which you are seeking a compact privilege ([see the list of state jurisprudence requirements/exams](#)).
