Budget Reductions

- Secretary of State
 - 14.4% cuts from Voter Outreach in FY21 & FY22
 - 1-3% anticipated reversions from operating funds depending on requirements that exceed remaining election security appropriation
 - 8% cut from Voter Outreach in FY23
 - \$400,000 is reserved for potential voter outreach in the 2022 General Election. Potential opportunities for reversion depending on candidates and issues
 - 1-3% anticipated reversions from other operating funds depending on requirements that exceed remaining election security appropriation
- Indiana Election Division
 - 12% cuts from Voter List Maintenance in FY21 & FY22
 - Existing contract encumbrances and a reduced VLM budget will accommodate a narrow scope



Election Security Capital Appropriation

- Statewide cybersecurity threat detection program
 - Advanced persistent threat actors have targeted state and county networks, but we have stopped that activity as it has been detected. Year to date activity includes:
 - 20,000 endpoint and over 100 network sensors
 - Nearly 200,000 alerts
 - Approx. 12,500 critical or major alerts
 - As of the 2020 general, 84 counties had partial or full implementations
- Voting Equipment Upgrades and Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail
 - Upgrades to MicroVote DREs with a VVPAT
 - Funded upgrades for 12 of 14 counties who have safe, but older equipment
- Risk Limiting Audits w/ Ball State's Voting System Technical Oversight Program
- Incident Response Planning w/ Indiana University's Center for Applied Cybersecurity Research



Election COVID-19 Response

- Primary Election
 - Postponed to June 2nd with corresponding adjustments to filing deadlines and vote center plans
 - Introduced no-fault absentee voting for the primary
 - Online absentee ballot requests using DLN or SSN4
 - Provided optional multi-factor authentication on IndianaVoters.com, Indiana's online voter registration platform
- General Election
 - Acquired access to the EI-ISAC situation room through our partnership with DHS
 - Provides a national platform for information sharing
 - Between October 26th and November 6th, more than 800 IP's were shared with counties, IOT and vendors to block



PPE & Voter Turnout

PPE

• Supplied all 92 counties with personal protective equipment (PPE) for the primary and general elections, which was distributed by the Indiana National Guard

Turnout

• 65 percent, or 3,068,542 of Indiana's 4.7 million registered voters cast a vote in the general election

Division COVID-19 Response

- Auto Dealers Services Division
 - Extended the expiration date of 135,754 interim plates by an additional sixty (60) days until BMV branches reopened
- Securities Division
 - Quickly pivoted to using virtual tools to finalize exams and investigations
- Business Services Division
 - Fully operational remote call center
 - Provided prompt reinstatement and business assistance to numerous Hoosier business owners rushing to apply for a federal PPP loans
 - Expedited the remote notary process
