




#### State Parks Revenue

- FY 2020 \$33,910,802
- FY 2019 \$32,464,748
- FY 2018 \$33,645,608
- FY 2017 \$32,170,051
- FY 2016 \$30,484,893

- FY 2021 (thru November) \$18,766,263
- FY 2020 (thru November) \$14,444,731







#### **Next Level Trails**

- 17 grants were awarded totaling \$24.7M
- Local match valued at \$12.5M
- Approximately 42 miles of trails to be developed
- Five projects are completed totaling ~9 miles of trails







#### **Deferred Maintenance**




- DNR received a \$30M allocation in September of 2019
- Concentrating on infrastructure
- 54 rooms at Abe Martin Lodge (Brown County) being renovated
- 70+ new restroom facilities are being installed
- Rehab wastewater treatment facilities



# DNR Law Enforcement Conducts K-9 Training

- Trained seven K-9 teams representing the states of Kansas, Oregon, Utah and Virginia
- K-9 teams are trained in man-tracking, wildlife detection and article searches






Governor Announced Two New State

• Ravinia State Forest, near Paragon, encompasses 1,500 Acres


 Mountain Tea State Forest, near Nashville, encompasses 1,150 Acres

 These new state forests will serve as two locations for the Governor's "Million Trees" Program, an initiative to plant one million new trees by 2025





## FY 2022/2023 Budget Request



- Budget request is contingent on the access of dedicated funds to the limit of FY 2020 revenue totals. This access will minimize the impact of the 15% reduction of General Fund appropriations.
- FY 2022 & 2023 General Fund totals reflect a \$650k annual increase for a Law Enforcement recruit school and OPEB actuarial recommended contributions.
