Project Description:

Corp. 0940 West Clark Community Schools- The project includes the following:

- Replacement of wireless devices for replacement of obsolete HP Steam 11 devices used throughout the district. Purchase of 238 devices
- Silver Creek MS and HS
- Borden HS

- Professional development for certified staff in the use of new devices within the classroom environment.

- 65 inch Castable TV Setup are roughly \$1410 per and include a 65 inch 4k TV, 4k Apple TV, Apple TV Mount and Rolling TV Mount
- HP Replacement Cases are roughly \$25 per •
