RE: Approval of Governing Body Reorganization – North White School Corporation Board of School Trustees

MEMORANDUM

Recommendation: approve governing body reorganization.

Pursuant to IC 20-23-8-10(a)(2), the North White School Corporation (the “Corporation”), by its Board of School Trustees on March 13, 2017, adopted a resolution to initiate a plan to change the composition of its governing body. Subsequent to the Corporation adopting the resolution to reorganize its governing body, the Corporation submitted the attached materials for the State Board of Education’s (“Board”) review and consideration. The materials include the prior governing body plan, the resolution adopted by the Corporation and the minutes from the Corporation’s meeting during which the resolution was adopted, the publication information that includes the language of the amended provisions of the governing body plan, and the county clerk’s certification that no protest petitions or alternative plans were submitted to the clerk’s office. The governing body resolution seeks to amend the following provisions:

 - 7 board members from 4 geographically defined areas

 - Honey Creek Township x2
 - Monon Township x2
 - Monon Corporation x1
- Term of Office

 - Board members must be residents of one of the four geographically defined areas

Revised Plan for Approval

- Number and Residential Districts
 - 7 board members from 3 geographically defined areas and 1 at-large district comprised of entire geographical area of the North White School Corporation School District
 - Liberty Township x2
 - Honey Creek Township x2
 - Monon Township x2
 - At-large x1

- Term of Office – Transition of Residential District Representation
 - 4 years except as modified by the Transition Plan
- Eligibility for Membership on Board – Residency Requirement
 - Members must be a resident of the district they represent
- Time of Election

After review of the materials provided by the Corporation, it is evident that 1) the governing body resolution was properly approved by the Corporation, 2) the resolution was properly published in a local newspaper, and 3) that no protest petitions or alternative plans were submitted to the clerk's office. Furthermore, the new governing plan satisfies the requirements of I.C. 20-23-8, IC 20-23-4-27, IC 20-23-4-29.1, and IC 3-8-1-34. As such, the new governing body plan is recommended for approval by the Board pursuant to IC 20-23-8-15.

RESOLUTION INITIATING AN
AMENDED AND RESTATED PLAN OF
ORGANIZATION CHANGING GOVERNING BODY
COMPOSITION AND MANNER OF ELECTION

WHEREAS, North White School Corporation (hereinafter "NWSC") was created pursuant to a countywide school reorganization plan that was adopted pursuant to the School Reorganization Act of 1959; approved by the Indiana State Commission on School Reorganization on or about November 17, 1961; and ratified by the voters of the newly created NWSC school district at a primary election held on May 8, 1962; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees (hereinafter "Board") of NWSC was originally constituted as a seven-member non-partisan elected Board with all seven members thereof elected as residents from within one of four geographically defined areas within NWSC (two members elected from Liberty Township, two members elected from Honey Creek Township, two members Monon Township, and one member from the Monon Corporation) with all members of the Board voted upon by all voters within the school district; and

WHEREAS, subsequent shifts in population as well as sustained difficulties in attracting candidates for Board office within some, if not most of the geographically defined Board residential districts have caused the current Board to conclude that there should be initiated a proposed plan to change the composition and method of electing the NWSC Board; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Indiana Code ("IC") 20-23-8, et seq., provide the Board with the authority and designated processes by which such a proposed plan to change the composition and method of electing a governing body of a public school corporation might be initiated, advertised and ultimately adopted;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Board that pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 20-23-8-10(a)(2), it hereby adopts the following changes in the NWSC Organization Plan by which members of the NWSC Board are to be elected following the Effective Date hereof, as set forth below.

(End of Recitals - Here Follows Plan Change)

Plan for Governing Body Composition Change

A. Board of School Trustees

1. Number and Residential Districts - The governance of NWSC shall be vested in a non-partisan Board composed of seven (7) members elected at a November general election in accordance with the provisions of IC 20-23-4-29.1 and of IC 3-8-2-4, IC 3-8-2.5 and IC 3-8-1. There shall be created three (3) geographically defined and limited residential districts from which two (2) members residing therein shall be elected to the NWSC governing body

(thereby comprising a total of six (6) resident members) and an "at large" district comprised of the entire geographical area of the NWSC school district from which one (1) member shall be elected. Residential districts are as follows:

- a. District #1 - Liberty Township
- b. District #2 - Honey Creek Township
- c. District #3 - Monon Township

2. Term of Office - Membership on the NWSC Board shall constitute the holding of a "lucrative office" as said term is used in Article 2, §9, of the Constitution of the State of Indiana. Members shall be elected to a term of office of four (4) years commencing as of January 1 of the year following the year of their election, except as otherwise herein provided.
3. Organization and Appointment of Officers - The Board shall annually organize within fifteen (15) days after the commencement date of the members' terms of office, or within such time as might otherwise be required by applicable law. The Board shall select from among its membership a president, vice president and secretary, each of whom shall be a different member of the Board. The Board may make such other appointments as permitted by, and in accordance with, applicable law.
4. Compensation - Members shall be entitled to compensation for the performance of their duties on the Board, as limited by applicable law and as determined, from time to time, by resolution of the Board.
5. Eligibility for Membership on Board - To be eligible to serve on the Board, a candidate for election to the Board must have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years prior to the date that the candidate's term of office would begin. Candidates running for election to the Board from one of the three geographically limited and defined residential districts must have been a continuous resident of that residential district for a period of time in excess of one (1) year prior to the date of the general election on which the candidate's name appears on the ballot for election to the Board. Property ownership shall not be an eligibility requirement for a candidate seeking election to the Board.
6. Vacancies on Board - Vacancies on the Board existing because of the death of a school board member shall be filled in the manner provided by IC 20-26-4-4.5, as from time to time amended. Vacancies on the Board existing for any reason other than death of an elected, qualified and acting school board member shall be filled in the manner provided by IC 20-26-4-4(c), as from time to time amended.

2. Transition of Residential District Representation - The representation of the existing residential districts shall be transitioned under this proposed plan change in the following manner:

Upon the end of the term of the Monon Corporation representative, Member Rebecca Princell, the vacancy created by the expiration of her term shall be filled by an "at large" member to be elected by the entire geographical area of the NWSC school district.

3. Election Date for Board Members under Proposed Plan Change - Upon passage this proposed plan change and its becoming effective upon the Effective Date, all members of the Board will be elected as general elections held in November of the appropriate years. The current Board membership positions will be elected in accordance with the following schedule:

C. Retention of Terms of Originally Adopted Plan of Organization.

Except as specifically modified herein in those particulars including the manner and time of their election, their residency, transitional terms of office and time of election of the members of the Board, as set forth herein, all other terms and conditions of the original NWSC Plan of Reorganization, as approved by the Indiana State Commission on School Reorganization on or about November 17, 1961; and ratified by the voters of the newly created NWSC school distribute at a primary election held on May 8, 1962, shall remain fully effective after the Effective Date.

D. Effective Date

The terms and conditions related to the appointment of a Board member from the "at large" position, shall become effective upon adoption of this plan, as provided at IC 20-23-8-19. All other aspects of this plan change shall become effective as of January 1, 2017.

(End of Plan Change)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of this Board is directed to cause notice of this Board's adoption of the foregoing plan to be published, as required by the provisions of IC 20-23-8-14, in a newspaper of general circulation published in White County, Indiana.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the superintendent, school corporation legal counsel and the officers of this Board shall take all other actions and execute all other documents as are reasonably convenient or otherwise necessary to effect the change in the plan for the selection of this governing body as hereinabove set forth.

Organizational Meeting

The School Board shall organize annually in July at a meeting held in accordance with law. The meeting shall be called to order by the Superintendent who shall serve as presiding officer until the election of a President.

Board of Finance of the North White School Corporation

The School Board shall establish a Board of Finance for the Corporation consisting of the members of the School Board. The Corporation's Board of Finance shall meet at least once each calendar year during the period after the first Monday and on or before the last day of January. At the first meeting in each calendar year, the Board of Finance shall elect a President and a Secretary from its membership. These officers shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified.

In addition to its annual meeting in January of each calendar year, the President of the Board of Finance shall convene the Board whenever requested to do so by one (1) of the members of the Board, and as necessary to perform the Board's statutory duties. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the Board's business. All meetings of the Board of Finance shall be open to the public and the Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Board which shall be approved and signed by the President and attested to by the Secretary. This record of proceedings shall be a public record covered by I.C. 5-13-1.

During the annual meeting of the Board of Finance in January of each calendar year, the Corporation's investment officer shall make a written report to the Board summarizing the Corporation's investments during the preceding calendar year and naming each institution or entity in which the Corporation's money was deposited in the preceding year. The Board of Finance shall receive and review the report and the overall investment policy of the Corporation.

The Board of Finance shall designate and commission one or more financial institution(s) meeting the statutory standards for a depository of

Corporation funds to serve as a depository for these funds. The Board is authorized to revoke the commission of a depository for Corporation funds. In its consideration of a proposal to revoke the commission of a depository to receive and hold Corporation funds, the Board of Finance shall apply the statutory standards and follow the statutory procedure for its consideration of this decision.

Officers

The Board shall elect from its members a President, Vice President, and a Secretary all of whom are separate members.

The Board shall also appoint a Treasurer of the Board and of the Corporation who is not the Superintendent or a Board member.

Election of officers shall be by a majority of the full Board. Where no such majority exists on the first vote, a second vote shall be cast for the two (2) candidates who received the greatest number of votes.

Officers shall serve for one (1) year and until their respective successors are elected and shall qualify. An officer may be removed for cause by a majority vote of the full Board. The Board shall fill a vacancy in either office within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of the vacancy.

Motions

The Board shall, at the organizational meeting:

- A. designate a day, place, and time for regular meetings which shall be held at least once every month;
- B. designate a time for regular study sessions of the Board periodically but at least semiannually;
- C.

authorize the President of the Board to appoint individual Board members to any necessary committees or as representatives to various organizations;

- D. appoint a legal counsel;
- E. appoint a Board member as legislative liaison to the Indiana School Boards Association.

Committees

Committees appointed by the Board shall, when specifically charged to do so by the Board, conduct studies, make recommendations to the Board, and act in an advisory capacity, but shall not take action on behalf of the Board.

Meetings of Board-appointed committees shall be subject to the Open Door Law (I.C. 5-14-1.5, 5-14-1.5-2) and must abide by its provisions whenever a committee meets to receive information, deliberate, make recommendations, establish a policy, or make a decision.

The President shall, as soon after the organizational meeting as practicable, appoint members of the Board to standing committees where they shall serve a term of one (1) year.

Ad hoc committees may be created and charged at any time by the President.

Members of committees shall serve until the committee is discharged.

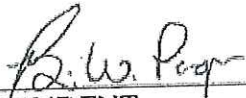

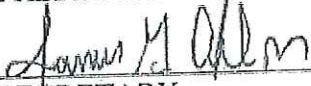

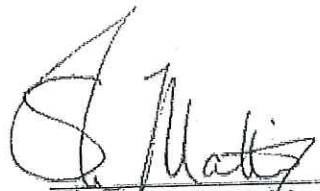

2. Transition of Residential District Representation - The representation of the existing residential districts shall be transitioned under this proposed plan change in the following manner:

Upon the end of the term of the Monon Corporation representative, Member Rebecca Princell, the vacancy created by the expiration of her term shall be filled by an "at large" member to be elected by the entire geographical area of the NWSC school district.

3. Election Date for Board Members under Proposed Plan Change - Upon passage this proposed plan change and its becoming effective upon the Effective Date, all members of the Board will be elected as general elections held in November of the appropriate years. The current Board membership positions will be elected in accordance with the following schedule:

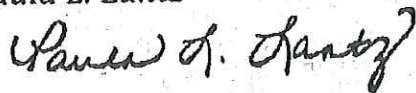
