Finding: Lafayette Meadows Elementary School’s appeal of its 2015-16 category placement of a “C” grade should be denied.

I. Facts

Lafayette Meadows Elementary School (“Lafayette Meadows”), part of the MSD Southwest Allen County School Corporation, received a letter grade of “C” for the 2015-16 school year. Lafayette Meadows appealed the “C” grade due to concerns regarding the 2015-16 ISTEP assessment.

II. Argument and Analysis

Lafayette Meadows contends that the 2015-16 ISTEP results of many for its students were invalid due to multiple technology issues the school experienced during the administration of the online assessment. Lafayette Meadows asserts that “those disruptions removed any standardization of the testing environment.”¹ In other words, Lafayette Meadows is asserting that the technology issues experienced by its students were the direct cause of the school’s lower ISTEP scores for the 2015-16 school year.

However, it is not possible to ascertain if the school’s technology issues caused the lower ISTEP scores or if the lower scores were caused by other factors. For example, the school’s argument does not account for the ISTEP’s more rigorous standards incorporated during the last two years. The 2015-16 ISTEP test was the second year of a new state assessment for grades 3-8 based on Indiana’s more rigorous college and career ready standards. As a result of the transition to new standards and assessment, a new baseline was established for ISTEP beginning in 2015.

In light of the more rigorous college and career ready standards recently incorporated into ISTEP, which coincided with the school’s technology issues, it impossible to determine the cause of the school’s lower scores.

For the foregoing reasons, I find that Lafayette Meadows’s appeal for the 2015-16 school year should be denied and its 2015-16 category placement of a “C” should not be replaced with a null grade.
