Subject: Common school loan amendment

The following school corporation requests approval to extend the time frame to expend loan proceeds that were awarded in 2020. State Board of Education's common school loan policy includes a provision that technology advances must be used within one (1) year after the State Board of Education approves the advance. Neither school corporation is asking for additional funds to amend the scope of the original project.

Penn Harris Madison (7175) School officials request approval for an extension of the one-year deadline to expend Spring 2020 common school technology loan proceeds. The school corporation received approval for a technology advancement for \$1,122,735, which included the following:

- 51 Classroom Projectors
- 3200 New Switch Ports
- 465 HP mini 800 desktop computer, 24" monitor, brackets, and warranty
- 990 Chromebooks
- 465 Replacement Computers and Monitors
- 115 Projector Lamps
- Software Licenses for Edmentum, Naviance, Turnitin, and Adobe Suite

The one-year period expires May 13, 2021. The school corporation requests an extension until August 31, 2021 to expend the funds. The reason for the delay is manufacturer production and shipping delays.

Washington Township Schools (5370) School officials request approval for an extension of the one-year deadline to expend Spring 2020 common school technology loan proceeds. The school corporation received approval for a technology advancement for \$1,097,500, which included the following:

- 3130 Chromebooks with Setup and Configuration
- 1500 Chromebook Cases

The one-year period expires May 13, 2021. The school corporation requests an extension until June 1, 2021 to expend the funds. The reason for the delay is supply chain and shipping demands on the part of the vendor.
