

IDOE Tier Based School Improvement Grant Conditions

Invest in sustainable practices, policies, and procedures that can be replicated

Focus on Intervention vs. Remediation

Expand <u>equitable</u> support to Title I Focus and Priority schools

Ensure conservative use of funds

Determine a <u>funding cap</u> that creates sustainability

 Establish a gradual <u>release</u> of funding for schools funded multiple years

IDOE Tier Based School Improvement Grant Conditions

- Promote a selected <u>menu of research based interventions</u> targeted to identified school improvement areas (early learning, literacy, leadership, positive school wide behavior, family/community involvement, etc.)
- Develop <u>school turnaround networks</u> on common issues and work (region, leadership, effective math programs, RTI, etc.)
- Maximize monitoring and accountability for short-term and long-term effectiveness
