Re: Latch Key Program Waiver Request – Tri-County School Corporation

## Recommendation: Approve the Latch Key Program Waiver Request.

Tri-County School Corporation ("Tri-County") is seeking approval of a school-age child care program requirement waiver for the 2018-2019 school year. Approval by the Indiana State Board of Education ("Board") is required for Latch Key program waivers under IC 20-26-5-2.

School-age child care programs, commonly known as Latch Key programs, are programs which provide care and education for children of working parents. This program is designed to be a link between the home and the school. Certified, qualified and experienced child care providers supervise, teach and interact with children to ensure that they are cared for, supervised, exposed to many learning activities, allowed to complete homework and share enjoyment in a relaxed and carefully designed developmentally appropriate environment.

A school corporation may seek a waiver from the child care program requirement if the school corporation believes compliance with the requirement would result in "undue hardship." IC 20-26-5-2(c) explains:

- (c) A school corporation shall receive a waiver from the state board of the requirement under subsection (a) if the school corporation believes that the school corporation would experience an undue hardship due to a low number of eligible children intending to use a child care program, regardless of whether the child care program is conducted by the school corporation or under a contractual agreement. To receive a waiver, the school corporation must include a detailed description of the school corporation's attempt to implement a child care program including the following:
  - (1) A description of the steps taken to:
    - (A) conduct a child care program described in subsection (a)(1); or
    - (B) actively solicit nonprofit organizations or for-profit organizations to implement a child care program as provided in subsection (a)(2).
  - (2) Evidence that a request in writing was made to each parent to contact the school corporation to indicate the parent's willingness to use a child care program and documentation of the results received from parents.

In other words, to be eligible for such a waiver, the school corporation must demonstrate that it has made a good-faith effort to determine the feasibility of creating such a program as well as parent interest in utilizing a Latch Key program.

The Indiana Department of Education's ("Department") publicized deadline for all waiver requests is September 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. Tri-County's Latch Key program waiver request was submitted May 2, 2018.

Western provided all supporting documentation required, including:

- A written description of the steps taken to determine the feasibility of a Latch Key program and/or to actively solicit other non-profit or for-profit organizations to implement the program.
- Evidence that a request in writing was made to all parents to contact the school corporation to indicate their willingness to utilize the Latch Key program and documentation of any parental survey results.
- Analysis of parent interest and projected attendance from the implementation of such a program.
- The nature of the hardship that the school corporation would experience due to a low number of eligible children intending to utilize the Latch Key program services.

The Department has deferred to the Board's discretion for approval or rejection of Tri-County's Latch Key program waiver request for the 2018-2019 school year.

**Recommendation:** Because IC 20-26-5-2(c) states that a "school corporation shall receive a waiver" if it provides the information outlined in the statute, Board staff recommends granting the waiver.

To Whom It May Concern,

On behalf of Tri-County School Corporation I am requesting a wavier for the 2018-2019 school year for a Latch Key Program. We have operated an after school program in grades K-6 for several years. Each year we have had inconsistent use of the program, unpaid fees for the program and much turnover in staff. The program has become a liability for the school corporation.

In our March newsletter we asked parents to respond to a needs survey on the program. The newsletter goes out to the parents of all 742 students in our corporation. I have attached a copy of the survey for your review. We have had one parent return the survey stating they would use the program.

We have made contact with local churches to solicit their interest in partnering with us and have had no success. We have a new child care center in our community and they may be interested in taking over the program once they become established, however, they will not be ready for the 2018-2019 school year.

Our current program runs five days a week from 2:50pm-6:00pm. We transport students from the K-2 building to the 3-6 building where the program is held. We charge \$6 per session and serve snacks each evening. Our total cost including transportation, salary/benefits and supplies for the 180 day program is \$12,360. This is an average of \$68 per day. This past year our average attendance has been 7.3 students per day for an average of \$43.80 in revenue. This does not include the daily fees which are not collected.

We respectfully ask that we receive a waiver for the 2018-2019 school year. We are in hopes the new child care center in town can provide this service for our families in the future.
