SUBJECT: Common School Fund Advancements for Construction and Technology Programs

The Office of School Finance received and evaluated applications for construction and technology advancements from the Common School Fund under I.C. 20-49-3 from August 3, 2012, through September 7, 2012. There is \$50,000,000 available for advancements for these programs. That amount was divided equally between construction and technology loans making available \$25,000,000 for each loan type.

Technology

The Office of Finance received requests for common school technology loans from 33 corporations during the application period. Based upon internal discussions regarding the 33 applications received and reviewed by the Department, we request that you approve 33 requests at the October 10 meeting of the Board.

We request approval of applications totaling \$17,217,791.00, as referenced below:

Based upon internal discussions regarding the 8 applications received and reviewed by the Department, we request that you approve 7 requests and deny 1 request as listed below at the October 10 meeting of the Board.

Centerville-Abington Community Schools – The project at Centerville High School includes the following:

• Re-roof sections that are older than 30 years

All school facilities currently owned/leased by the school corporation are being used. Recommend approval.

MSD of Wayne Township – The project at Westlake Elementary School includes the following:

- Replace obsolete gas-fired boilers (26+ years old) with new high efficiency modular condensing boilers
- Replace energy inefficient air-cooled chiller (20+ years old) with new high efficiency chiller
- Upgrade the existing pneumatic temperature control system to modern DDC Energy Management System

All school facilities currently owned/leased by the school corporation are being used. Recommend approval.

Brownsburg Community School Corporation – The project at a currently vacant building that formerly housed a high, intermediate and elementary school includes the following:

- Renovate approximately 21,000 square feet to house district's pre-school special education program
- Renovation will create:
 - o Eight classrooms
 - o A large motor skills classroom
 - o A school clinic
 - Food service areas
 - o Offices and other support functions

All school facilities currently owned/leased by the school corporation will be used upon completion of this project. Recommend approval.

School City of Mishawaka – The project at Mishawaka High School includes the following:

- Replace windows with more energy efficient windows

All school facilities currently owned/leased by the school corporation are being used except John Beard and Caleb Mills Elementary Schools. The facilities were being marketed for sale until legislative changes regarding unused facilities and charter schools. These facilities are currently included on the unused facilities list for charter schools maintained by the Department. Recommend approval.

Lake Station Community Schools – The project at Carl J. Polk Elementary School includes the following:

- Replace boilers that are 29 years old
- Replace exterior windows and doors
- Demolish and replace galvanized domestic water lines
- Demolish and replace plumbing fixtures and equipment
- Abate asbestos in water line tunnels under the classrooms

All school facilities, except Central Elementary School, currently owned/leased by the school corporation are being used. Central Elementary School was closed after the 2010-2011 school year. Central was built in 1934 and will be demolished unless a Charter School or suitable buyer wishes to occupy the building. Recommend approval.

Plainfield Community School Corporation – We recommend denial of the Plainfield Community School Corporation request for a common school construction loan for \$1,318,000 because the school corporation does not fall within the lowest 40% of assessed valuation per ADM as required in I.C. 20-49-4-9.

Summary:

The common school construction requests represent corporations within the lowest 40% of Assessed Value to ADM. As a matter of information, the State Board of Finance has established the interest rate for the construction program at 4.0 percent per annum and the educational technology program at 1.0 percent per annum.
