Identity: Crown Point Christian School is intended to be an extension of the Christian training children receive in the home. The school is placed within a large single-family residential development. CPCS draws students from a wide geographical area within Northwest Indiana and the far south suburbs of Chicago, including rural, suburban and urban settings. The student population is diverse, with Caucasian, African American, Indian and Asian ethnicities represented. As part of the admission process each student's parents are interviewed and must indicate agreement with the association's mission and statement of faith.

Curriculum: The CPCS curriculum is regularly and rigorously reviewed for educational standards and for reflection of the Christian worldview that is represented by our mission statement. Beginning in the 2010-2011 school year, CPCS teachers have aligned Pre-K through 8th grade curriculum with state standards using online software in all subject areas. CPCS strives to select new curriculum based upon its alignment with Indiana state standards.

Testing History: Crown Point Christian School has earned an A in Indiana's PL 221 system, scoring above the state average in all areas.

1. School Entity to be declared a Freeway School:

Crown Point Christian School (CPCS) is an association of evangelical Christians committed to providing a biblically based, Christ-centered education that assists parents in preparing children spiritually, socially, academically and physically to honor God in all aspects of life. Crown Point Christian School is intended to be an extension of the Christian training children receive in the home. Together, teachers and parents partner in training each child for a life of service and obedience to God, for His glory.

The Crown Point Christian School Association was formed in 1984, and in 1985, the school began with pre-school in a classroom of the Crown Point Christian Reformed Church. CPCS added grades annually until the school was comprised of pre-kindergarten through grade six. In 1995, the seventh and eighth grades were added and the first eighth grade graduation was held in May, 1997. By the fall of 1998, the school had outgrown available classroom space and relocated at Living Stones Fellowship Church. Steady, significant growth in student enrollment has continued to the present time. Crown Point Christian School realized a dream for their own permanent home in January of 2007. The state-of-the art, 56,000 square foot facility is located just west of the City of Crown Point, within the town of St. John, Indiana. The school has 15 classrooms, a computer lab, a library, a music room, an art room and a playground. A gymnasium and three additional classrooms, including a science lab were completed in 2008. Four additional classrooms were added in 2011, and a nine classroom addition is currently under construction with an August, 2013 goal for completion. Technology, including computers and CATV cables are available in every classroom. Two soccer fields, a track and softball field were completed in the 2008-2009 school year.

Crown Point Christian School is governed by a board of trustees comprised of 9 to 15 members, elected by the association members in an annual meeting each spring. Association members are school supporters who are committed to Christ, are members of an evangelical, biblically based church, are financially supportive of the school or pay tuition, or are an employee of the school, and are in agreement with and pledge to support CPCS's Constitution and the school's mission. The school board determines policies, sets the vision of CPCS, and directs the principal to carry out its policies. Any member of the association, except an employee of the school, is eligible to serve as a board member. Annually the board nominates a slate of candidates for the board membership and the association votes for members of the board from this slate. The principal provides the executive leadership that serves the staff, students and association in carrying out the school's mission.

2. Demographic Data:

Crown Point Christian School currently provides Christ-centered education for 578 pre-kindergarten through eighth grade students. For the 2013-2014 school year, 608 students are registered. CPCS is offering two sections of pre-kindergarten, three sections of kindergarten through fifth grade and seventh grade, and two sections of 6th and 8th grades. CPCS adheres to state guidelines for pupil to teacher ratios. The school employs a full-time administrator, an assistant principal, 29 full-time teachers and 2 part-time teachers this year. Next year the school will employ a full-time administrator, an assistant principal, 31 full-time teachers and 1 part-time

teacher. The school is placed within a large single-family residential development. CPCS draws students from a wide geographical area within Northwest Indiana and the far south suburbs of Chicago, including rural, suburban and urban settings. The student population is diverse, with Caucasian, African American, Indian and Asian ethnicities represented. As part of the admission process each student's parents are interviewed and must indicate agreement with the association's mission and statement of faith.

Crown Point Christian School teachers are evangelical Christians who practice love, joy, patience, kindness, self-control, gentleness, faithfulness, and truthfulness and model biblical principles in making choices. Full-time classroom teachers are expected to hold a state-issued license and within two years of hire must obtain Indiana certification if they hold a certificate from another state. A roster of teacher licensure information is included in Appendix A. Positions for new teachers are posted within the CSI newsletter and area Christian college education departments. Potential Crown Point Christian School teachers are interviewed by the Education Committee.

One board member serves as the head of the Education Committee, which is charged with reviewing and approving the curriculum. A curriculum review schedule has been established and recorded. Currently, Crown Point Christian School uses the Scott/ Foresman Pearson in Pre-K through 2nd and 6th-8th. Sengage-National Geographic is used in 3rd – 5th grades for reading and language arts. The Chicago Math curriculum is provided for grades Pre-K through 8th grade. 1st – 5th grade teachers assess math facts progress using Rocket Math. CPCS seeks to prepare middle school students for high school by offering a high school level algebra course, and inviting local area high school guidance counselors to present the program offerings of their various schools. Crown Point Christian students go on to local high schools, including but not limited to Covenant Christian High School in Demotte, Indiana, Illiana Christian High School in Lansing, Illinois, Crown Point High School, Lake Central High School in St. John, Indiana, Hanover Senior High School in Cedar Lake, Indiana, and Lowell High School in Lowell, IN.

The Mission of Crown Point Christian School is as follows:

The mission (purpose) of Crown Point Christian School is to instruct children, in cooperation with the home and the church, from a distinctively Christian perspective so that each child will think and act in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible. The particular Christian perspective from which the school educates is that of the Reformed tradition. (This tradition dates back in history to the Reformation and is expressed in such documents as the Heidelberg Catechism, The Belgic Confession, The Canons of Dordt, The Westminster Catechism, and the Westminster Confession)

The lordship of Christ and the providential care of God permeate everything, and Christian teachers strive daily to help each child know the Lord. Christian teachers are charged with the responsibility of working cooperatively with parents to guide each child toward academic, social, physical and emotional growth and spiritual maturity. Together, we strive to promote the following ideals for our students:

1. Development of the Christian virtues: love, honesty, courtesy, obedience, respect, tolerance, cooperation, and the discipline of body and mind consistent with God's Word.
2. Development of Christian citizenship and leadership: in the school, in one's chosen occupation, and in the community consistent with God's Word.
3. Development of Christian learning utilizing the full potential of our God given ability.

3. Statutes and Rules to be suspended:

As a Christian school, our mission statement, as well as our distinctive Biblical philosophy of education, drive Crown Point Christian School's program. CPCS consciously and intentionally seeks to instill within its students a Christian worldview. As a result, CPCS requests the suspension of the following rules and statutes:

- a. Safety Education - IC 20-30-5-8; Hygiene - IC 20-30-5-9; and Alcoholic beverages, tobacco, prescription drugs, and controlled substances; instruction in kindergarten through grade 12 – IC 20-30-5-11:**

CPCS requests the ability to waive these statutes. CPCS is not currently offering a one-semester course on safety education for 8th grade students. Education in safety, hygiene and drug education is included in the health, physical education and sex education curriculum. CPCS would be open to sharing the health education leaflets provided by the state health commissioner and state superintendents. Additionally, CPCS provides the D.A.R.E. curriculum to fifth grade students for substance abuse prevention.

- b. Textbook Adoption and Curriculum – 511 IAC 6.1-5-5; IC 20-20-5-2; IC 20-20-5-23; IC 20-26-12-24; IC 20-26-12-28; 511 IAC 6.1 3-4 through 6.1 – 5.4:**

The CPCS curriculum is rigorously reviewed for educational standards and for reflection of the Christian worldview that is represented by our mission statement. CPCS wishes to waive this statute to insure flexibility in choosing textbooks that conform to our mission statement.

Beginning in the 2010-2011 school year, CPCS teachers have aligned Pre-K through 8th grade curriculum with state standards using online software, Curriculum Trak in all subject areas. CPCS strives to select new curriculum based upon its alignment with Indiana state standards.

Changes in curriculum will be included in the review process.

Crown Point Christian School strives to demonstrate its commitment to excellence. Crown Point Christian School is a member of Christian Schools International, and the Indiana Non-Public School Association. CPCS has earned Christian Schools International (CSI) accreditation.

All of the above rationales support Crown Point Christian School's request to be exempt from the stated rules and statutes.

4. Minimum Educational Benefits to be Obtained as the Result of this Contract:

- a. The student attendance rate for the first semester 2012-2013 school year is 97.2%, well above the 90% State ideal. Student instructional minutes meet or exceed State guidelines. CPCS is in session 180 days.
- b. The percentage of students meeting academic standards under the ISTEP+ program will be calculated next school year. The percentage of students passing will increase 2% yearly until CPCS has met an 85% pass rate. After that time, the percentage of students passing will increase 1% yearly until CPCS has met a 90% pass rate.

5. Privileges to be granted as a result of this contract:

- a. CPCS will retain the privilege of providing excellent, Christ-centered education.
- b. CPCS will be allowed to administer the ISTEP+ standardized testing to students.
- c. Freeway accreditation will grant CPCS continued status and reputation in our community, as well as education guidance and accountability that accompanies accreditation by the Indiana Department of Education.
- d. CPCS will have the opportunity to apply for Professional Development Grants for teachers.
- e. Eighth grade students will more easily transfer to other area high schools.

6. Benchmark by which the Freeway School will determine that the educational benefits are being attained:

- a. ISTEP+ pass rates in 2012 were 90% overall, with 91% in ELA and 89% in MA. Our goal is to stay at 90% or above in the future years.
- b. Attendance rates will remain at 97% or higher, which is well above the state standard.

7. Strategies for the curriculum to address issues related to: character education; hygiene; alcohol and drugs; diseases transmitted sexually; honesty; respect; and abstinence and restraint:

- a. Character education, specifically, the development of Christian morals and virtues, is emphasized within every subject and extracurricular activity. A student's character development and work habits are assessed and reviewed on his/her grade reports. Traits of honesty and respect are highly valued and modeled for students.
- b. Hygiene concerns are addressed within the health, social studies and physical education curriculum. The school is linked with the public health department; a public health nurse visits regularly and share information regarding proper hygiene.
- c. Substance abuse prevention is addressed within the health, social studies and physical education curriculum. Fifth grade students also participate in the D.A.R.E. program.

- d. Concepts such as abstinence and restraint, sexually transmitted diseases/AIDS are addressed with 6th through 8th grade students through a specialized training program (H.E.A.R.T.S.).

8. The plan for securing and maintaining a safe and disciplined learning environment for students and teachers:

According to the CSI Accreditation Site Visit Report, “The school’s discipline plan is clearly written and easily understood. (3.2.7).” The school doors are locked. Visitors must register with the front office, and all school employees submit to a criminal background check. Fire drill and tornado warning maps and procedures are posted on all classroom door exits. Teachers have all had evacuation and pathogen training, and every classroom is equipped with a first aid kit and a box of latex gloves. Each staff member has been trained in CPR. Both the State Fire Marshall and the Indiana Health Department inspect the school regularly.

9. The quantitative measures used to determine that the terms of this contract are being carried out:

CPCS will annually report our ISTEP+ and attendance data to the Indiana Department of Education through the STN site. Since the 2010-2011 school year, NWEA MAP testing has been conducted in grades 1-5 and will continue in the 2013-2014 year in grades 1st & 2nd.
