IED Office Remodel

From June 2 to at least the week of August 11, 2025, the IED office in room E204 of the Indiana Government Center South building will be closed to the public. The office is being remodeled to include updated physical security features recommended by the Department of Homeland Security. Staff remains available by phone or email and can meet virtually when needed. Election-related filings can be made in the SOS Business Services Division located in room E018, which is in the basement level (essentially two floors directly below from the IED office across from the elevator bay). Mailed documents can still be sent to our E204 address in IGCS.

SAVE THE DATE: IED Annual Conference

A reminder that the 2026 Annual Election Administrators' Conference will be held December 15 to 17, 2025, at the Hyatt Regency hotel in downtown Indianapolis. Traditionally, the first day is a half-day (afternoon) and the next two days are full days. Expect a formal 'call to meeting' in late summer to register for the vent and to access the hotel block.

SVRS Annual Audits

Baker Tilly will be reaching out to counties this month to provide instructions to complete the SVRS Annual Audits. Completion of the SVRS Annual Audits is critical to maintain the security of the statewide voter registration system. In most cases, the county's SVRS administrator will need to be the one to complete the work, which includes reviewing SVRS user accounts and validating specific system workflows. More information that details the specific activities included for this important work were sent in late May. Civix hosted training sessions on this effort in May so check out the recordings if you were not able to attend. The Help Desk can provide support, if needed.

QUESTION OF THE MONTH

Q. Can a voter's Power of Attorney (POA) register the individual to vote and sign the form on behalf of the voter? What about an absentee ballot application or absentee ballot security envelope?

A. Before we get to the answer, keep in mind that a voter with a disability or a person who cannot speak or read the English language can have assistance from nearly any person except for their employer or union representative for many election procedures. Additionally, when a POA provides this support, a copy of the POA is to be attached to the record. These general rules are assumed in the explanation below.

For **voter registration**, the voter's POA does not give the individual the power to determine **where** and **whether** the person receiving assistance should be registered to vote. State law (IC 30-5-5-14) makes it clear that POA's do not have authority to execute a person's voter registration application. However, certain voters may have help completing their registration application, including signing the voter's name, if the affidavit of assistance is filled out.

Similar rules apply to an **absentee ballot application**. Certain voters may have assistance in filling out the application, including signing the voter's name, if the affidavit of assistance is completed.

When it comes to the **absentee ballot to vote** itself, support is more restricted under state law. Only the voter can complete their own ballot, enclose it in the ballot security envelope, and sign their name or make their mark on the voter's affidavit. A POA does NOT have authority to complete an absentee ballot on another person's behalf!

Instead, a POA can attest to the voter's signature or mark on the absentee ballot affidavit, or seal the envelope on the voter's behalf. Additionally, any person but those noted above can also assist with sealing the envelope. The affidavit of assistance must be completed by the individual providing this support.

Voters who cannot personally mark their own ballot are to vote by **travel board**. Alternatively, a **voter with print disabilities** can request an accessible ABS ballot. A voter can also **vote in-person before or on Election Day** and request assistance from persons noted above or ABS voter board members or Election Day judges after completing a PRE-3 form before entering the voting booth.

IN FOCUS: Statewide VLM Project Continues


Last month we touched on card 1 of the statewide postcard mailing. Those cards entered the mail stream on or around May 27, 2025, with the final batch being dropped by the end of May. These cards were sent by non-forwardable first class mail to all Hoosier voters in "active" status. This means cards that cannot be delivered by the USPS will "return to sender" (that is, IED) and initiate the process to send the card 2 to those impacted voters.

On or around June 20, 2025, the Voter Response Card (VRC or Card 2) will be mailed to those voters where Card 1 was returned by the USPS as undeliverable to the state. This second card is sent as forwardable, first-class mail and includes a postage pre-paid "response card" for the voter to confirm, update, or cancel their Indiana registration. IED must receive this card not later than August 29, 2025, to avoid the voter's registration being moved to "inactive" status. (Note: The instructions note that the state recommends the voter drop the card in the mail by August 22, 2025, to ensure IED receives it by August 29, 2025. However, the voter can still send the card back after August 22, 2025, though actions taken on their record will depend on when the response card was received.)

A voter receiving the VRC can confirm their registration address is accurate; update it within their same Indiana county; or cancel their registration if they moved out of their Indiana county. The voter must sign the response card to make their response effective. Additionally, if the voter wants to update their registration address within their same county, then they must answer the age and citizenship questions.

Counties will begin receiving card 2 data to act upon sometime after June 20, 2025. Please make sure you are working through your list maintenance hoppers routinely, as counties need to complete the first round of hopper work by September 9, 2025. This will allow Civix to upload "late-arriving" response cards into the VLM hoppers for counties to process out as a registration form.

More information, including training materials and detailed memos, will be shared as the project moves forward. Please be sure to add one of the two SVRS training dates to your calendar: June 3 and June 5. Lastly, information about this project is available at indianavoters.com/VLM. In some cases, however, we may need to direct the voter back to the county, as county registration officials make the final determination on how to process the VRC.

YOUR RESPONSE IS NEEDED!

The Indiana Election Division recently sent you a postcard that was returned by the United States Postal Service. To ensure that your voter registration information is accurate, please.

Fill out, sign, and return the attached postage paid postcard as soon as possible and not later than August 22, 2025. The Indiana Election Division must receive this postcard not later than August 29, 2025.

If you do not respond to this postcard **QR** do not update your voter registration, you may still be eligible to vote at the residence address listed on this card in 2025, 2026, 2027, and 2028

However, if you do not return this postcard AND do not vote in an election conducted in 2025, 2026. 2027, or 2028, then your voter registration at the residence address listed on this postcard may be cancelled following the November 2028 election.
