

Hancock County Election Board Resolution No. 2014-01
Amend Vote Center Plan

Whereas, the IC 3-11-18.1-15 allows the local Election Board to amend the county's vote center plan; and,

Whereas, the Hancock County Election Board has determined it is in the interest of the citizens of Hancock County to properly update the plan as needed; and,

Whereas, the timeframe for adopting this resolution is not prescribed in statute; but rather becomes effective upon the unanimous vote of the entire membership;

Now, therefore, be it resolved pursuant IC 3-11-18.1-15 the Hancock County Election Board, by unanimous vote of the board's entire membership, amends the vote center plan to update page 16 of the original plan to read

Further, this resolution shall take effect immediately and may only be rescinded by unanimous vote of the entire membership of the Hancock County Election Board





DUTIES OF PRECINCT OFFICERS

Pursuant to IC 3-11-18.1-4 (6) The Hancock Vote Center plan designates the following precinct election board members to administer Vote Centers. Note: All Vote Center poll workers are required to attend technical training.

Title	Duties
Inspector	<p>Over all in charge of the precinct. Greets the Public. Swears in Poll Workers. Receives election materials from the County Election Board. In an early vote center environment, accompanied by the Judge Opposite, will bring Absentee Ballots to the Hancock County Annex to be locked up to be counted on Election Day. On Election Day, in conjunction with the Judge of the Opposite party, certifies M-100 beginning and ending tape. Returns election materials to the County Election Board. Requests photo identification from voters.</p>
Judge Opposite	<p>The Judge Opposite is from the opposite political party of the Inspector and acts as the check and balance to the Inspector. Swears in the Inspector. Oversees the electronic pollbook. In an early vote center environment, accompanied by the Inspector, will bring Absentee Ballots to the Hancock County Annex to be locked up to be counted on Election Day. On Election Day, in conjunction with the Inspector, certifies M-100 beginning and ending tape. Returns election materials to the County Election Board.</p>
Election Assistant	<p>These Election Assistants: may assist in the distribution of ballots, may check voters into the electronic pollbooks, may assist a voter with the Automark machine*, may assist a voter in the election booth* <i>(*pending proper bi-partisan accompaniment and completion of proper paperwork.)</i> In an Early Voter Center environment, may verify the necessary signatures are on the outside of the secrecy envelope, may, give direction to the voter on how to deposit ballot into the M-100 Scanner may indicate to the voter the location of the exit.</p>


