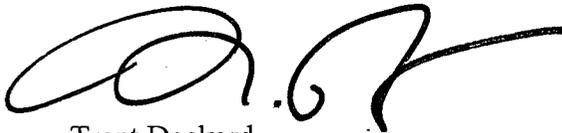

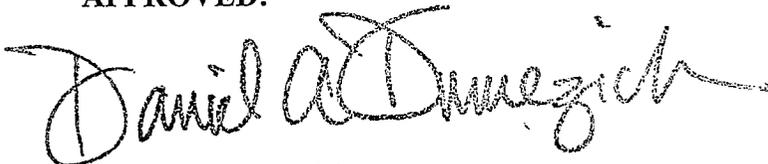

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I would like to take
3 this opportunity to call to order the Indiana
4 Election Commission. This meeting of the
5 Indiana Election Commission is now called to
6 order.

7 The following members of the Commission are
8 present: Chairman Dan Dumezich; to my left is
9 Anthony Long; to my right, skipping over Brad
10 King, is Bryce Bennett; and to Anthony Long's
11 left is Suzannah Overholt.

12 Okay. Our, the Indiana Election staff are:
13 Codirectors Trent Deckard to my left; down a few
14 people, Brad King to my right; co general
15 counsel are Leslie Barnes and Dale Simmons.

16 The court reporter today is Tami Brown from
17 Connor & Associates.

18 Before I begin today, I would like to
19 remind everyone on behalf of the Commission to
20 identify yourself when you begin to speak.
21 Spell your name when you identify yourself.
22 Speak clearly. And please do not speak when
23 someone else is speaking, especially if it is a
24 member of the Commission.

25 I would request Mr. Deckard and Mr. King to

1 confirm that the Commission meeting has been
2 properly noticed as required under the Open Door
3 Law.

4 BRAD KING KING: Mr. Chairman, members of
5 the Commission, notice of this meeting was
6 posted in compliance with the Open Door Law.

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I recognize Mr. Deckard
8 and Mr. King to present minutes from the last
9 Commission meeting of August 29, 2013.

10 BRAD KING KING: Mr. Chairman, members of
11 the Commission, the minutes of that meeting were
12 reviewed by Mr. Deckard and myself, signed and
13 submitted for your review and approval.

14 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there a motion to
15 approve these minutes?

16 TRENT DECKARD: So moved.

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Second?

18 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Discussion? Hearing
20 none, all in favor say aye.

21 (Chorus of ayes.)

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: All opposed, nay?

23 (No response.)

24 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.
25 The motion to approve the minutes is adopted.

1 Use of signature stamps during the course
2 of this, is there a motion to authorize the
3 Election Commission to affix each member's
4 signature stamp to the final copy of this order
5 and other orders approved by the Commission at
6 this meeting?

7 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

8 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there a second?

9 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, any
11 discussion?

12 (No response.)

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
14 favor of the motion, on the adoption of the
15 motion, indicate by saying aye.

16 (Chorus of ayes.)

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay?

18 (No response.)

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it,
20 and the motion is approved.

21 Next we have Campaign Finance, adoption of
22 orders, 2013-142 through 2013-180 from the
23 hearing at the August 29th Commission meeting.

24 These, I would ask Campaign Finance staff,
25 Ms. Taylor and Ms. Thompson, to present

1 information to the Commission regarding these
2 final orders, which reflect the decisions made
3 by the Commission at its last meeting.

4 ABBEY TAYLOR TAYLOR: Mr. Chairman, Members
5 of the Commission, Orders 2013-142 through
6 2013-180 have been prepared from the actions
7 taken at the August 29th meeting, and these
8 orders are ready for adoption.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. Is there a
10 motion to adopt orders here?

11 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I'll move to adopt
12 Orders 2013-142 through 2013-180 inclusive.

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there a second?

14 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: I will second
15 that motion.

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Any discussion?

17 (No response.)

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
19 favor of the adoption of Orders 2013-142 through
20 2013-180 indicate by saying aye.

21 (Chorus of ayes.)

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

23 (No response.)

24 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.
25 Campaign Finance Referrals to the Attorney

1 General for collections: I understand that
2 there are referrals of committees to the
3 Attorney General for collecting fines, and the
4 Campaign Finance staff can provide information
5 regarding those referrals.

6 I turn to Abbey and Michelle to provide us
7 that information.

8 ABBEY TAYLOR: Mr. Chairman, under your
9 Campaign Finance tab, there is a list that we're
10 going to turn over to the Attorney General for
11 collections.

12 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Is that the first list
13 under the tab?

14 ABBEY TAYLOR: Second.

15 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Paper-clipped together
16 where it says Attorney General list?

17 ABBEY TAYLOR: Yes.

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Do we need to take any
19 action on this?

20 ABBEY TAYLOR: No.

21 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Thank you for bringing
22 this in.

23 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: For everyone present
24 today who plans to testify regarding any matter
25 coming before the Commission, including Campaign

1 Finance or Voting System matters, please stand
2 for the administration of the oath. And I would
3 recognize Mr. Dale Simmons to administer the
4 oath.

5 (Oath administered.)

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. The opportunity
7 for committees with representatives present
8 today to accept reduced penalties: Before
9 proceeding with enforcement actions, we want to
10 give any committee present a final opportunity
11 to pay a reduced civil penalty by waiving the
12 right to present evidence and arguments to the
13 Commission. Any committee is welcome to present
14 evidence and arguments for a proposed penalty to
15 be waived. But this opportunity is solely for
16 those who want to waive that presentation and
17 accept the reduced penalty.

18 The arrangements are as follows: If it is
19 the committee's first violation, the arrangement
20 is for the committee to agree to pay 25 percent
21 of the proposed fine, plus mailing costs.

22 If it is the committee's second violation,
23 the arrangement is for the committee to agree to
24 pay 50 percent of the proposed fine, plus
25 mailing costs.

1 If this is the committee's third violation,
2 the committee would agree to pay 75 percent of
3 the proposed violation plus mailing costs.

4 Do I hear a motion from the Commission to
5 approve this arrangement?

6 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there a second?

8 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, is
10 there any discussion?

11 (No response.)

12 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
13 favor of adopting these procedures, please
14 indicate by saying aye.

15 (Chorus of ayes.)

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay?

17 (No response.)

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.
19 The motion is adopted.

20 Are there any committees here who would
21 like to accept this arrangement? If so, please
22 come forward.

23 Please state your name and cause number,
24 and spell your name as well.

25 TIM HENDERSON: Sir, my name is Tim

1 Henderson, it's T-I-M, H-E-N-D-E-R-S-O-N. I'm
2 here representing Broden for State Senate, Cause
3 No. 2013-4495-136. It's our committee's second
4 offense.

5 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Have we located it in
6 our books?

7 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: It shows a zero.

8 ABBEY TAYLOR: One settlement agreement.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: That finance for
10 \$1,000.45.

11 ABBEY TAYLOR: Correct.

12 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: So it is the second
13 time you would be paying half of that, plus
14 mailing costs.

15 TIM HENDERSON: Okay.

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Very good.

17 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Thank you.

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Anyone else that would
19 like to come forward to take this arrangement?

20 RUSS SIPES: Russ Sipes for the Indiana
21 Federation of Democratic Women. I have a
22 question. If there were two violations at the
23 same time, does that count as first or second?

24 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: First.

25 RUSS SIPES: The Federation would like to

1 accept a reduced fine.

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Matter number, and
3 spell your name for the record -- unless I
4 missed it.

5 RUSS SIPES: I don't have the matter
6 number. The spelling is S-I-P-E-S, first name
7 Russ, R-U-S-S.

8 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Michelle or Abbey,
9 please?

10 ABBEY TAYLOR: This is the Indiana
11 Federation of Democratic Women Political Action
12 Committee. This is for the annual report, Cause
13 No. 2013-6406-87. The first one is a proposed
14 civil penalty of \$250.45. The second one, Cause
15 No. 2013-6406-116 is for the 2012 election
16 report and has a proposed civil penalty of
17 \$350.25.

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Do you agree -- go on.

19 ABBEY TAYLOR: Neither one of these
20 committees have been before the Board, or either
21 one of these.

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: So this is a first
23 offense?

24 RUSS SIPES: Yes.

25 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: You understand that you

1 will be paying 25 percent of that?

2 RUSS SIPES: Yes.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: If I was smarter I
4 could add it up -- \$250.90 total.

5 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Very good, sir. Thank
6 you. And you'll be receiving a bill in the
7 mail.

8 Anyone else? Anyone else? Is there anyone
9 else here for Campaign Finance hearing?

10 (No response.)

11 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. Then I'm going
12 to have to go through the adoption of those
13 procedures.

14 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: There is, sir.

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Campaign Finance? What
16 are you here for?

17 TED ADAMS: This would be the matter of
18 John T. Young, cause No. 6379. I'm sorry, I
19 don't have them all. There's three different
20 cause numbers.

21 ABBEY TAYLOR: 2013 --

22 TED ADAMS: I'm sorry. 6379-10, 6379-134,
23 6379-135.

24 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there anyone here
25 for Campaign Finance other than these two

1 gentlemen?

2 Go ahead. We can cut to the chase, then.

3 Do you agree with these fines?

4 TED ADAMS: We were going to make a
5 presentation.

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. Well, what we're
7 going to do is, we're going to have the Campaign
8 Finance staff go first and tell us about the
9 violations, and then you can tell us your side
10 and we'll go from there.

11 Now, will both of you state your name and
12 spell it for the record so I have that down?

13 TED ADAMS: Ted Adams, A-D-A-M-S.

14 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: And you are an attorney
15 representing him?

16 TED ADAMS: No, I am his treasurer.

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: He is who?

18 JOHN T. YOUNG: I'm John T. Young. I was
19 the candidate.

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Young commonly spelled.

21 JOHN T. YOUNG: Y-O-U-N-G.

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Very good. And ladies,
23 if you could tell us what the heck is going on,
24 it would be greatly appreciated.

25 ABBEY TAYLOR: Committee to Elect John T.

1 Young, Cause No. 2013-6379-10, this is for his
2 2012 annual report. His proposed civil penalty
3 was \$50.45.

4 The next one on page 3 is for the 2012
5 supplemental report, Cause No. 2013-6379-134,
6 has proposed civil penalty of \$1,000.45. And
7 again, the third one is also for a supplemental
8 report, and that fine is also \$1,000.45, so
9 three.

10 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Were there any prior
11 violations?

12 ABBEY TAYLOR: No.

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Very good, sir, if you
14 could present your position.

15 TED ADAMS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I was
16 the treasurer, and I'm here to ask for mercy. I
17 know ignorance is no defense to the law. I
18 operate in Title 9 and Title 35, I rarely am in
19 Title 3, which I learned a lot about.

20 Our campaign, we lost our election. Our
21 finances are at zero. I was unaware of an
22 annual report that needed to be filed. I spoke
23 with Mr. King and Mr. Deckard on the phone, and
24 they were very gracious, and once I found out
25 what I had done, which was unfortunately a year

1 later, I filed immediately. I thought the CFA
2 11, if I'm getting my charge right, covered
3 everything, and I thought I was done.

4 But we -- there is no dispute that there's
5 definitely a violation. I see the public
6 policy. But it's our first attempt, our first
7 foray into politics, and I would just ask for
8 mercy, as our account balance is zero.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: What was the period you
10 ran and what did you run for?

11 JOHN T. YOUNG: I ran for state
12 Representative for District 47, which covered
13 mostly half of Johnson County, and I ran in the
14 primary campaign, 2012.

15 Then also the --

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: And you did not
17 prevail?

18 JOHN T. YOUNG: I did not prevail. I did
19 not win. And I considered disbanding my
20 campaign as well; however, not knowing if I want
21 to continue, I don't know if I want to do that
22 at this time.

23 But I would point out that the
24 contributions in question, that we did not do
25 the report for, were funds that were my personal

1 funds that I put into it.

2 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: These are the
3 supplemental violations? How much was it?

4 TED ADAMS: Two payments of \$3,000 apiece,
5 I believe.

6 JOHN T. YOUNG: And they were to cover
7 expenditures for a mailing that I did at the
8 very end of the election process. And I -- I
9 was not aware, since it was my own money, and my
10 father had also contributed some money, that I
11 wasn't aware that I had to do anything, that I
12 had to file a supplemental report. Obviously we
13 reported it.

14 So certainly we are not arguing that we did
15 not violate the statute. We certainly did. But
16 I would ask under the circumstances, my
17 treasurer did file the proper report, and this
18 may be looked at as excusable neglect, or
19 perhaps if the Commission would even merge the
20 two counts with the CFA violations together,
21 because they were part of the same transaction,
22 if you will.

23 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Have you closed the
24 committee now?

25 JOHN T. YOUNG: I have not. I have

1 debated --

2 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I understand your
3 treasurer said your committee has no money.

4 JOHN T. YOUNG: Correct.

5 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: If you close this
6 committee, and it wouldn't dissuade you from
7 running again, you could open a new committee.
8 If you would be willing to file a final report
9 and close the committee, I think that we have a
10 policy that would probably accomplish what you
11 just asked us to do.

12 JOHN T. YOUNG: And I can -- one thing that
13 I'm here for is I want to take responsibility
14 for this. So I understand, the concern is with
15 disbanding, if I do open the committee again, if
16 I'm still going to need to deal with this
17 tissue.

18 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: No.

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: That would be an all
20 new committee. And we think you showing up here
21 is in fact dealing with it.

22 JOHN T. YOUNG: Thank you.

23 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I mean, we realize
24 that --

25 TED ADAMS: He may want an all new

1 treasurer, too.

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I was going to suggest
3 you refund any fees you might have received.

4 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I would suggest we
5 table this, so they won't have to --

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: -- come back in?

7 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Procedurally we table
8 it until the next meeting, they file their
9 report, and you will receive notice of the
10 meeting, but if disbanded I will move to dismiss
11 the case against you.

12 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: And someone will second
13 it and we will vote 4/0 on it.

14 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: The chairman is
15 absolutely right. Being here, explaining the
16 situation.

17 TED ADAMS: Extending my apologies.

18 JOHN T. YOUNG: And that explains it well
19 to me.

20 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: We appreciate that.

21 JOHN T. YOUNG: Then we will file the
22 correct documents to disband it. And we
23 thank --

24 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: What will they file
25 now?

1 ABBEY TAYLOR: They need to file a final
2 report.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Just a final report,
4 showing it zeros out, and showing this is a
5 final report, and the committee disbanded.

6 ABBEY TAYLOR TAYLOR: Yes.

7 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: And this will come
8 back on the agenda at our next meeting and we'll
9 dispose of it.

10 JOHN T. YOUNG: And we do not need to
11 appear.

12 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That's correct.

13 JOHN T. YOUNG: It was nice, I got to take
14 him to Shapiro's today.

15 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I did that on the way
16 up here last night, so I guess we have something
17 in common.

18 JOHN T. YOUNG: Ladies and gentlemen, thank
19 you very much. I appreciate your time.

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I would ask the
21 Campaign Finance staff to lead us in a
22 discussion regarding Brad Thompson for Secretary
23 of State -- or State Senate -- I'm sorry -- and
24 it's file No. 2013, or Cause No. 2013-6407-88.

25 ABBEY TAYLOR: Mr. Chairman, behind your

1 spreadsheet there's a letter from Mr. Thompson
2 that he sent me this morning.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: He want to disclose
4 his relationship?

5 ABBEY TAYLOR: No.

6 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Or lack thereof.

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Do you want to tell us
8 what the letter says -- well, wait a second. We
9 can shortcut that.

10 So he was -- notice was sent for today and
11 this is what he has sent us.

12 ABBEY TAYLOR: Right. He couldn't make --
13 he phoned me yesterday and said he couldn't make
14 it, and he asked me to send this.

15 MICHELLE THOMPSON: Mr. Thompson was given
16 a continuance at the August 29th hearing.

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Well, I guess I would
18 note that there is no one present to testify to
19 any of the remaining Campaign Finance matters.
20 So based on that, is there a motion to impose
21 the entire amount?

22 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I don't think
23 there's -- we've already done that. He asked to
24 reconsider, didn't he? Or is this the first
25 time?

1 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I think he was supposed
2 to show up. It was continued to today. So I'm
3 about ready to default on it, if that meets with
4 your approval.

5 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. We have a motion
7 to default Mr. Thompson.

8 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: I'll second the
9 motion.

10 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, is
11 there any discussion?

12 (No response.)

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: He didn't show up last
14 time. Of course, I understand he did have
15 surgery, but it seems to me an email the day
16 before is not really going to relieve him of his
17 duty and obligation to show up for a violation.
18 So with that in mind, any other comments?

19 (No response.)

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
21 favor of defaulting Brad Thompson for State
22 Senate indicate by saying aye.

23 (Chorus of ayes.)

24 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay?

25 (No response.)

1 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0. The ayes have it,
2 and he has been defaulted.

3 Do you have any further business to bring
4 before the Commission?

5 ABBEY TAYLOR: No, that's it.

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Now we go to VSTOP,
7 Voting Systems Technical Oversight Program.

8 We had received a report from Ball State in
9 our binders regarding the voter systems issues.
10 I would recognize Dr. Joseph Losco to provide us
11 with more detailed information regarding the
12 voting system issues.

13 JOE LOSCO: Yes. Mr. Chairman, Commission,
14 we have several reports for you today.

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Just for the record,
16 state your name.

17 JOE LOSCO: Yes. It's Joseph Losco
18 L-O-S-C-O.

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay.

20 JOE LOSCO: First deals with engineering
21 change orders, and Hart InterCivic. There was
22 an engineering change order that they requested
23 for their voting system. The ECO, or as it's
24 called, was evaluated by VSTOP according to the
25 protocol approved by the Indiana Election

1 Commission, and we found that it was
2 satisfactory and we are recommending approval.

3 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there a motion to
4 approve the recommended engineering change
5 orders?

6 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Second?

8 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Any discussion?

10 (No response.)

11 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
12 favor of the motion indicate by saying aye.

13 (Chorus of ayes.)

14 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

15 (No response.)

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it,
17 and the recommended engineering change orders
18 are approved.

19 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That's for Hart.

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Yes.

21 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: There's another one,
22 right?

23 JOE LOSCO: Yes, one more engineering
24 change order, this one from Dominion Voting
25 Systems. They have requested a certification

1 for what is called their SSL certificate for
2 their system. VSTOP, using the protocol
3 approved by the Commission, investigated it and
4 finds it complies with the code and recommends
5 approval.

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. Is there a
7 motion to approve the recommended engineering
8 change order?

9 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

10 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Seconded.

11 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: All in favor indicate
12 by saying aye.

13 (Chorus of ayes.)

14 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

15 (No response.)

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.

17 JOE LOSCO: On to new -- an amended
18 application for voting system certification at
19 the last Commission meeting in August, you
20 approved the election system software Unity
21 3.4.0.0.

22 There was one item that was left off of the
23 list of approved firmware. That was the Model
24 650, Version 2.2.2.0. That was -- it was our
25 intention to include that on the form. It was

1 simply an omission on our part. But that was in
2 fact tested and approved by us as well. So we
3 would ask that you approve the amended version.

4 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: And that is the ES&S
5 Unity 3.4.00 system?

6 JOE LOSCO: Yes, that's correct.

7 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: And specifically what
8 we're talking about is hardware number --

9 JOE LOSCO: The firmware number, Model 650,
10 Version 2.2.2.0. Yes, we did evaluate that and
11 test that. It was just left off the sheet that
12 you approved last time.

13 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: The hardware and the
14 software, was that preapproved last time?

15 JOE LOSCO: Yes, everything else was.

16 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So this is just a
17 complete report on all the parts of it and then
18 the firmware part is what has been added.

19 JOE LOSCO: Yes.

20 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I move that we approve
21 the amended report.

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: The amended
23 certification, effective October 1st, 2013?

24 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That would be my
25 motion.

1 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Second?

2 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Seconded.

3 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, any
4 discussion?

5 (No response.)

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
7 favor of the motion to approve the ES&S Unity
8 3.4.0.0 voting system to correct the omission
9 regarding one of the prior, one of the
10 components of that system, indicate by saying
11 aye.

12 (Chorus of ayes.)

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

14 (No response.)

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.

16 The next item on the agenda is the
17 recommendation concerning the recertification of
18 certain currently certified voting systems whose
19 certifications will expire on October 1st, 2013.
20 Correct, sir?

21 JOE LOSCO: Yes, it is. And the first item
22 will take up is the MicroVote System 4.0B
23 modification. That was originally approved by
24 this Commission on August 12, 2012. It was an
25 application filed for recertification or

1 reevaluation. VSTOP, stopped using its
2 protocol, fully evaluated this and has
3 determined that it's identical with the
4 original, and we recommend that it be
5 recertified.

6 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I'm sorry, the report,
7 what I have is -- where is this in our agenda?

8 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: The green tab.

9 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: MicroVote tab. All
10 right. Are you recommending that this
11 recertification be approved?

12 JOE LOSCO: Yes, we are, Mr. Commissioner.

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Do I hear motion to
14 approve?

15 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Do we have a second?

17 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Seconded.

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: All in favor, indicate
19 by saying aye.

20 (Chorus of ayes.)

21 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.

24 JOE LOSCO: The next item we have is the

25 Hart InterCivic 6.2.1. This system was

1 originally certified by this Commission on
2 November 16, 2009. On the basis of our
3 evaluation, we find that the voting system meets
4 all the requirements of the code for
5 recertification in Indiana, and we would
6 recommend recertification for the Hart system.

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. I have been
8 advised that the Indiana law requires that the
9 full Commission consider the application for
10 renewal. The Election Division is required to
11 give notice to the clerk of each county
12 currently using the system.

13 And I understand that that has taken place;
14 is that accurate, for the record, Mr. Deckard?

15 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the
16 Commission, yes, it is. Mr. Deckard and myself
17 gave notice to the seven counties currently
18 using the Hart InterCivic System that's pending
19 this certification.

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Based on that, I would
21 like to give any clerk or any other interested
22 person present the opportunity to comment
23 regarding this application for recertification.

24 (No response.)

25 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. Hearing none.

1 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Your recommendation is
2 to approve the recert? So moved.

3 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Do you second?

4 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Seconded.

5 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, any
6 discussion?

7 (No response.)

8 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
9 favor of approval of this recertification,
10 please indicate by saying aye.

11 (Chorus of ayes.)

12 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

13 (No response.)

14 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.

15 JOE LOSCO: Okay. The next system for
16 recertification is the Unisyn OpenElect 1.1.
17 This was originally certified on June 28, 2012.
18 We have evaluated it using all of the approved
19 engineering change orders or ECOs, and find that
20 it is in compliance with the Indiana Code, and
21 we recommend recertification.

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I would ask again,
23 codirectors King and Deckard, have the counties
24 been notified?

25 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the

1 Commission, Mr. Deckard and myself did send a
2 notice to the two counties currently using this
3 system to notify them of this recertification
4 application.

5 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Are there any county
6 clerks or any other interested parties here that
7 would like to testify regarding this system?

8 (No response.)

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none.

10 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: I have a
11 question. Was the notice given in accordance
12 with the statutory procedures?

13 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, yes,
14 Mr. Commissioner, it was.

15 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I move to approve the
16 recertification.

17 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: I'll second
18 that motion.

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, any
20 discussion?

21 (No response.)

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
23 favor of the motion indicate by saying aye.

24 (Chorus of ayes.)

25 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

1 (No response.)

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.

3 JOE LOSCO: Mr. Chairman, the last item we
4 have is Election Systems Software ES&S, Unity
5 3.0.1.0 amendment. It was originally certified
6 on December 1st, 2009. VSTOP has evaluated it
7 and all its components, including the
8 engineering change orders, and we recommend
9 recertification.

10 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I would ask --

11 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Just a minute. Do we
12 have that one? I don't have that one.

13 TRENT DECKARD: Yes, it was.

14 JOE LOSCO: 3010.

15 TRENT DECKARD: It should be in that first
16 section.

17 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Oh, in the first,
18 behind the --

19 TRENT DECKARD: Yes.

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I would ask the
21 codirectors if it was properly notified of
22 recertification.

23 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the
24 Commission, Mr. Deckard and myself notified the
25 20-some counties which are current users of this

1 system to advise them of this recertification.

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: And was it done
3 pursuant to the statute?

4 BRAD KING: It was, Mr. Chairman.

5 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there anyone here
6 that would like to testify regarding this
7 system? Any county clerk? Going once, twice,
8 three times.

9 (No response.)

10 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Move we recertify.

11 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

12 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, any
13 discussion?

14 (No response.)

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
16 favor of the motion to recertify the system
17 please indicate by saying aye.

18 (Chorus of ayes.)

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

20 (No response.)

21 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0, the ayes have it.

22 JOE LOSCO: That's all we have. Thank you,
23 Mr. Chairman.

24 RAY SCHEELE: Mr. Chairman, if I could ask
25 one moment of indulgence, my name is Ray Scheele

1 the codirector of VSTOP as well. It's
2 S-C-H-E-E-L-E.

3 As you well know, our VSTOP program at Ball
4 State University relies a lot upon other
5 persons. And two of them are here with us
6 today, who are graduate assistants, and we would
7 just simply like to introduce them very quickly
8 to you. And Dr. Bagga will do that.

9 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Afraid he wasn't going
10 to get to speak today?

11 RAY SCHEELE: This is all choreographed.

12 JAY BAGGA: Mr. Chairman, I'm Jay Bagga,
13 J-A-Y, B-A-G-G-A. I'm also codirector of VSTOP,
14 and I'm pleased to be here.

15 I would like to introduce two of our grant
16 assistants who are doing master's programs in
17 computer science at Ball State. Priya Mishra,
18 if you want to spell your name.

19 PRIYA MISHRA: It's. Priya Mishra,
20 M-I-S-H-R-A.

21 JAY BAGGA: And Sujan Pradhan.

22 SUJAN PRADHAN: I'm Sujan Pradhan,
23 S-U-J-A-N, P-R-A-D-H-A-N.

24 JAY BAGGA: And they are very able and very
25 helpful assistants that are present at VSTOP.

1 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: We thank you very much
2 for your work. It is greatly appreciated.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: It is nice to see the
4 people who are probably doing all the work, the
5 faces in here, and we appreciate your being down
6 here.

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: In the future, faces
8 work out fine.

9 We certainly hope we didn't disappoint.

10 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I just had a
11 question about the -- this doesn't have to do
12 with the approval of the certifications, but the
13 way we're to review these forms for
14 certification.

15 Because I noticed that on the MicroVote
16 application -- I'm sorry, Mr. Chairman, is it
17 all right if I ask this question?

18 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Sure.

19 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: It's page 2, I
20 guess, of the application for certification.
21 And I noticed that on the MicroVote application
22 where it -- this is the box that says, "This
23 application must include the following," and all
24 the other applicants, you know, checked off the
25 things that were included. And this one is not

1 checked in any way.

2 I'm assuming that since you recommended
3 certification, that they actually did submit
4 everything they were supposed to. But I was
5 wondering if you do actually --

6 JOE LOSCO: Yes, Madam Commissioner, we
7 have made sure we've looked at all the
8 documentation as part of this.

9 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: So maybe in
10 the future it would just be helpful to go back
11 and make sure that they check these boxes.

12 And then the other thing I wanted to
13 raise -- I guess I will have forms on these one
14 of these days -- but I noticed that these
15 certification forms have numerous places for
16 signatures, but nowhere that I -- well, it stood
17 out to me that there are a number of places
18 where we're getting signatures from the
19 representatives of the manufacturers, but we're
20 not having them print their names.

21 And it stood out to me the most where
22 someone had, I think it was someone had a
23 digital signature, and that this Chris Ortiz,
24 was signing on behalf of Unisyn, he used his
25 digital signature for an oath or affirmation, so

1 his name is quite readable there, but then on
2 the page where they have the manufacturers'
3 certification and applicants' certification, the
4 second signature on that page is completely
5 illegible. I don't know if that is Mr. Ortiz or
6 someone else.

7 But I think it would be helpful to me to
8 know who's signing, when we can't read --

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I don't believe it is
10 Mr. Ortiz, because the manufacturer's
11 certification at the top is Mr. Ortiz'
12 signature, and they don't seem to match.

13 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Well, that's
14 what I was wondering. That's a printed name up
15 there, too. So I just don't really -- I mean it
16 could be -- yeah, you're right.

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: The digital signature
18 is in the back. I actually took that to be a
19 signature. I mostly print --

20 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: So if you
21 happen to be -- or is this a form change we
22 would have to approve?

23 TRENT DECKARD: I think it would be.

24 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I guess it's
25 something to think about.

1 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I'm not coming back to
2 that. We'll put that on the to-do list.

3 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Definitely.
4 Sorry. Those were just my observations.

5 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I just think maybe we
6 could reply and let them know, unless their
7 signatures are quite legible, they need to print
8 that on there. Otherwise, we wouldn't be able
9 to look at that and say it is a valid
10 authorization.

11 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: We wouldn't know who to
12 put in jail.

13 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Exactly.

14 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: With our Supreme
15 Court, if you do your signature that way, they
16 will send it back -- they make you sign it that
17 way.

18 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Yes, and I
19 know people who have received those. I married
20 one.

21 JOE LOSCO: We'll ask them to print their
22 names from now on.

23 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Thank you. That would
24 be great.

25 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Nice lead-in to our

1 approval of forms section.

2 In our last meeting the Commission tabled
3 consideration of the order until the last item
4 on today's agenda. That time has arrived.

5 I now would recognize Mr. Deckard and
6 Mr. King to present a revised version of order
7 2013-12, which has been included in our binders.

8 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the
9 Commission, order 2013-2 is behind the final tab
10 in the binders, and concerns absentee candidate
11 and registration forms.

12 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Do you have it?

13 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I do.

14 TRENT DECKARD: It may be this.

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I think we know where
16 yours are.

17 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, I presented
18 previously on this, so I would say that we have
19 worked to make the revisions that are reflected
20 in this proposed order, and I'll defer to
21 Mr. Deckard to discuss it.

22 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay.

23 TRENT DECKARD: I would agree with
24 Mr. King, and in particular, thanks to the
25 Commissioners for input and a lot of suggestions

1 on how we could make these function a little bit
2 better.

3 The one note I would make is that as some
4 of the code changes were quite a bit different
5 from previous codes, implementing the form
6 changes has been the very difficult part to make
7 that work for folks, and I hope the Commission
8 finds that the work reflects their wishes.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Thank you. If there's
10 no further discussion -- for the purposes of
11 discussion, is there a motion to amend Order
12 2013-2 to reflect the changes to the order as
13 presented?

14 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Second?

16 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: I hear a second. Is
18 there any discussion?

19 (No response.)

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none --

21 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: In the voluminous
22 communications, is there a new form that was
23 talking about a writing candidate to the school
24 board, is that included in here?

25 TRENT DECKARD: Yes, that is.

1 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That was not part of
2 what we had at the last meeting.

3 TRENT DECKARD: That's correct. It's page
4 26, I believe.

5 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: I don't know that I
6 understand it very well.

7 TRENT DECKARD: That should be in the
8 middle of the packet.

9 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Page 4.

10 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That's my
11 interpretation, when I looked at it, this one is
12 new, but everything else is what we had before
13 and has been corrected or changed, based on my
14 understanding. And I only point it out -- I
15 don't have any problem with it --I think it's
16 understood.

17 TRENT DECKARD: I think that's an accurate
18 reflection.

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: It is "an accurate" or
20 "inaccurate"?

21 TRENT DECKARD: An accurate.

22 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That was just a
23 comment or question I had so that everyone was
24 aware this was a new one that we hadn't dealt
25 with before. I'm sure we'll all want to run

1 down to the writing candidate school board.

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing no further
3 discussion, the question is to amend order
4 2013-2 to read as presented. All in favor
5 indicate by saying aye.

6 (Chorus of ayes.)

7 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

8 (No response.)

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0. The ayes have it,
10 and the amendment is approved.

11 Okay. For the purposes of discussion, is
12 there a motion to approve Order 2013-2 as
13 amended?

14 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: So moved.

15 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Is there a second?

16 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: Second.

17 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. Is there
18 discussion?

19 (No response.)

20 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: If there's no further
21 discussion, the question is to approve the order
22 2013-2 as amended.

23 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: That motion has been
24 made. I thought I made that motion.

25 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Okay. And we have a

1 second. There's no further discussion. All in
2 favor, say aye.

3 (Chorus of ayes.)

4 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

5 (No response.)

6 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0. The ayes have it,
7 and the order is approved.

8 Okay. Next meeting date: Since there is
9 no need to approve any more revised election
10 forms before the December 17, 2013 Election
11 Administrators Conference, we propose that be
12 the next time we meet.

13 And along those lines, after having
14 discussions with various members, we would ask
15 if there is any way that Mr. Deckard and
16 Mr. King could work together to develop a small
17 CLE program during that period -- and, if it
18 qualifies for ethics -- give Christmas presents.

19 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: Yeah, like two
20 or three hours of ethics.

21 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Well, I think it would
22 for us, if we were the presenters. If it was an
23 hour, we would get the additional ethics
24 credits.

25 COMMISSION MEMBER OVERHOLT: I'm wrapping

1 up a three-year cycle, so I need to --

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: That's where I'm going
3 with it.

4 So do you think it would be possible to do
5 that?

6 BRAD KING: Mr. Chairman, we will make our
7 very best efforts. Some of us are also
8 finishing our three-year cycle.

9 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Excellent. So with
10 that, I would propose the same time, on December
11 17th -- morning, that's right -- 10:00 o'clock
12 or 9:00 o'clock. So it would be 9:00 o'clock on
13 December 17th, at the Election Administrators
14 Conference.

15 BRAD KING: Which, Mr. Chairman, if I can
16 add, would be at the Marriott across the street.

17 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: 9:00 a.m. eastern
18 standard time.

19 BRAD KING: Yes, sir.

20 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: And which one?

21 BRAD KING: Downtown.

22 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Downtown Marriott?

23 TRENT DECKARD: The one that's on Maryland.

24 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: And the 17th is what
25 day of the week?

1 BRAD KING: Tuesday, sir.

2 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: All right. Wonderful.

3 Okay. So that is going to be our next meeting.

4 And based on that, the Indiana Election
5 Commission has finished its business for today.

6 Is there a motion for adjournment?

7 VICE CHAIRMAN LONG: Unless somebody has
8 some more business with the audience, I move to
9 adjourn.

10 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Second?

11 COMMISSION MEMBER BENNETT: I'll second
12 that motion.

13 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing a second, any
14 discussion?

15 (No response.)

16 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Hearing none, all in
17 favor indicate by saying aye.

18 (Chorus of ayes.)

19 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: Opposed, nay.

20 (No response.)

21 CHAIRMAN DUMEZICH: 4/0. The ayes have it.
22 And we really look forward to that CLE on ethics
23 in election.
