NARRATIVE

Public Law 262-2017 Consolidation Process

A. Identification

- 1. List Lake County voter status counts by precinct*
- 2. Per city, town and township, list each precinct under 600.
- 3. Prepare appropriate legislative district documentation*.
- 4. Print and assemble corresponding maps *

B. Consolidation

- 1. Consolidate each verified under 600 precinct with one or more adjoining precincts, according to boundary standards in 3-11-1.5-4 or 3-11 -1.5-5.
- 2. Limit precinct consolidation size to 1391 active voters (highest current precinct size is 1391)**
- 3. Presuming full precinct board attendance on Election Day, ascertain payroll savings, verify against actual 2016 General payroll*
 - a. Payroll savings indicated on top right hand corner of city/town page.
- 4. Review existing polling place combinations as well as future optimizations*
- 5. Review modeling of shortest and longest polling place distances.*
- 6. Ascertain and review highway, bridge, water and other potential location detriments for future polling locations.
- 7. Watch and keep intact city district configurations. Base comparisons on current precincts versus future consolidated precincts.
- 8. Gather input from public officials, county office holders, city, town, and township chairmen, precinct committeemen and most importantly from citizen voters.

C. Establishment Order

- 1. File the proposed order by completing:
 - a. All relevant IEC 8's.
 - b. All mapping.
 - c. All census block documentation.
 - See exhibit example.
 - ** Cedar Lake has 1391 active voters today and the County has 11 precincts with over 1200 active voters.
