## AMENDED WHITE COUNTY VOTE CENTER PLAN

In compliance with Indiana Code 3-11-18.1-4 and I.C. § 3-11-18.1-15, the White County Election Board proposes to amend its previously adopted plan for the establishment of Voting Centers in White County, to provide more convenient, efficient and cost effective voting access and procedures for all White County citizens. The following is an Amendment to the White County Vote Center Plan adopted by the White County Election Board on August 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

The population of White County, according to the 2010 Census, is 24,643.

The total number of registered voters is 16,808, as of the 2015 election.

Pursuant to the applicable statute, the Voting Center Plan includes the following information:

1. The total number of voting centers will be nine (9).
2. The location of each voting center is as follows:
  - A. The Wolcott Park Community Building, 601 South Burke Street, Wolcott, Indiana 47995.
  - B. The Idaville First Church of God, 11073 East 50 North, Idaville, Indiana 47950.
  - C. The Buffalo Christian Church, 303 East State Road 16, Buffalo, Indiana 47925.
  - D. The North White High School, 121 West State Road 16, Monon, Indiana 47959.
  - E. The Frontier Elementary School gymnasium, 811 South Railroad Street, Brookston, Indiana 47923.
  - F. The Comprehensive Development Center (CDC), 5053 Norway Road, Monticello, Indiana 47960.
  - G. The Fellowship Hall of Monticello Christian Church, 105 Gordon Road, Monticello, Indiana 47960.
  - H. The White-Carroll REMC Building, 302 North Sixth Street, Monticello, Indiana 47960.
  - I. The basement Conference Room, White County Building, 110 North Main Street, Monticello, Indiana 47960.
3. The effective date of the Order Approving the Original Plan was August 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The date of the Order Amending the Plan is January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2016.
4. A. The total number of registered voters in White County is 16,808.

- B. The total number of active voters is: 14,375.
- C. The total number of inactive voters is: 2,433.

5. The following is a list of the precincts which will be located in each of the above voting centers, with the understanding that any White County voter may vote in any Voting Center:

- A. Wolcott Park Community Building – Princeton and West Point Townships.
- B. Idaville Church of God – Cass, Lincoln and Jackson Townships.
- C. Buffalo Christian Church – Liberty Township.
- D. North White High School – Monon and Honey Creek Townships.
- E. Brookston Elementary Gymnasium – Prairie I, Prairie II, Big Creek and Round Grove Precincts.
- F. CDC, Monticello -- Union I and Union 2 Precincts.
- G. Monticello Christian Church, Monticello -- Union 3 and Union 7 Precincts.
- H. REMC Building, 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Monticello -- Union 5 and Union 6 Precincts.
- I. Basement Conference Room, White County Building, Monticello -- Union 4 Precinct.

6. Each voting Center will have one (1) inspector, one (1) clerk, and two (2) judges, one from each political party. At Voting Centers in Brookston, and REMC there will two (2) additional clerks. At the Voting Center at the Monticello Christian Church Fellowship Hall there will be one (1) additional clerk.

7. The Board in each Voting Center will administer the precincts assigned to that Voting Center.

8. At each voting Center, there will be one (1) inspector, one (1) judge from each of the political parties, and one (1) clerk, except for additional clerks for certain Voting Centers, as provided in Paragraph 6.

9. Each ballot type for each of nineteen precincts, applicable school board elections, and each political party in primary elections, shall be available, electronically, at each Voting Center.

10. Equipment used will be supplied by Robis Elections, Inc., and will consist of the following items installed at each Voting Center: One (1) or more laptop computers; ST-100 card activators; symbol bar code scanner; and Topaz signature pads.

11. Equipment description and accessibility features.

- A. The laptops will be used by poll workers to check voters in. The laptops will store and communicate voter information through a virtual proxy network (VPN). Each laptop will also communicate with the Clerk's Office central server to upload and download voter information.
- B. The ST-100 card activator will be used to encode the proper ballot style on each voting smart card to be inserted into the TXS touch screen voting machine.
- C. 2D barcodes located on the back of drivers' licenses or identification cards issued by the State will be scanned to identify each voter in the AskED e-poll book.

12. Two (2) electronic poll books shall be available at each Voting Center, except Brookston and REMC where two (2) additional poll books shall be available and Monticello Christian Church Fellowship Hall, where one (1) additional poll book shall be available, for a total of 23 electronic poll books.

13. Ballots shall be kept in a locked ballot box in a locked room inside another locked room in the basement of the White County Building. Anti-viral and anti-hacking procedures shall be implemented.

14. A Resolution of the White County Election Board certifying the accessibility of the Voting Centers and satellite early Voting Centers was attached to and made a part of the original plan dated August 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

15. A sketch of the Voting Center lay out to be used in each of the Voting Centers was attached to and made a part of the original Vote Center Plan, and a sketch of the Voting Center lay out for the Buffalo Christian Church and the Basement Conference Room of the White County Building is attached to this Amended Vote Center Plan.

16. The number of satellite offices to be established under Indiana Code § 3-11-10-26.3, in addition to the clerk's Office in the Court House shall be one, to be located at Brookston, Indiana.

17. The method and timing of providing voter data to persons entitled to receive it is as follows: Data will only be accessible from an administrator's portal using the AskED command center to manage sensitive voter data. The AskED Command Center will allow the County Clerk to upload and download data from the State Voter Registration System.
