

Greetings from the Governor



Act now to receive your W-2 faster

Complete 4 simple steps to receive your W-2 faster and eliminate the risk of getting lost in the mail.

- 1. Log into PeopleSoft HCM **Employee Self-Service**
- 2. Select the Payroll tile
- 3. Select the W2 and W2c Consent
- 4. Check the Consent box and click Submit

The deadline to consent to an electronic W-2 is December 31. By consenting:

- You will receive an immediate notification when your W-2 is available.
- You can view (or print) your W-2 from PeopleSoft.
- You can eliminate the expense of mailing your W-2

Contact your agency payroll department with any questions.

Following Governor Braun's appointment of Abby Gray as Commissioner for the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor (OUCC) and pressure to lower rates, the OUCC is recommending denial of AES Indiana's pending rate

request. AES Indiana is requesting a \$192.9 million base rate increase from the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC).

Mammograms can help catch cancer early

Employees and spouses eligible for the ActiveHealth program can earn \$50 in Wellness **Rewards** for completing a mammogram. Getting a mammogram can help catch cancer early, sometimes up to three years before you notice



symptoms. Plus, the screening only takes 10 to 15 minutes. Talk with your doctor about how often you should receive your mammogram, but most women should start receiving one at age 40. Make your health a priority and schedule an appointment today.

Have you gotten your flu vaccine for 2025?

To make it easy to get your flu shot, there are several upcoming State of Indiana vaccine clinics. Register to receive one today and employees and spouses eligible for the ActiveHealth program can earn \$25 in Wellness Rewards per eligible



vaccine received. Getting your flu vaccine can help reduce your risk of getting sick or developing severe symptoms while protecting the people around you this flu season. During the 2023-24 flu season in the U.S., there were an estimated 35 million to 65 million influenza illnesses and upwards of 800,000 hospitalizations due to influenza.

Please note that the PeopleSoft functionality allowing you to initiate changes to your health and life plan coverage based on qualifying life events, such as birth, adoption, marriage, or divorce through Employee Self Service (ESS) will not be available to employees during the Open Enrollment season between Oct. 24, 2025 - Nov. 24, 2025.
