"Indiana has the largest deployment of 'Text to 911' in the United States" said Treasurer Mitchell. "Since 911 was created, Indiana has been a leader in this industry. Statewide 'Text to 911' capabilities are yet another example of our leadership and innovation in this arena."

'Text to 911' services allow people who are deaf, hard of hearing, and speaking impaired to access participating emergency service call centers by sending a text message to 911 in lieu of making a voice call or needing a telephone relay service. "Text to 911" also allows residents in dangerous situations who are unable to risk the noise of a call to send a text for help.
